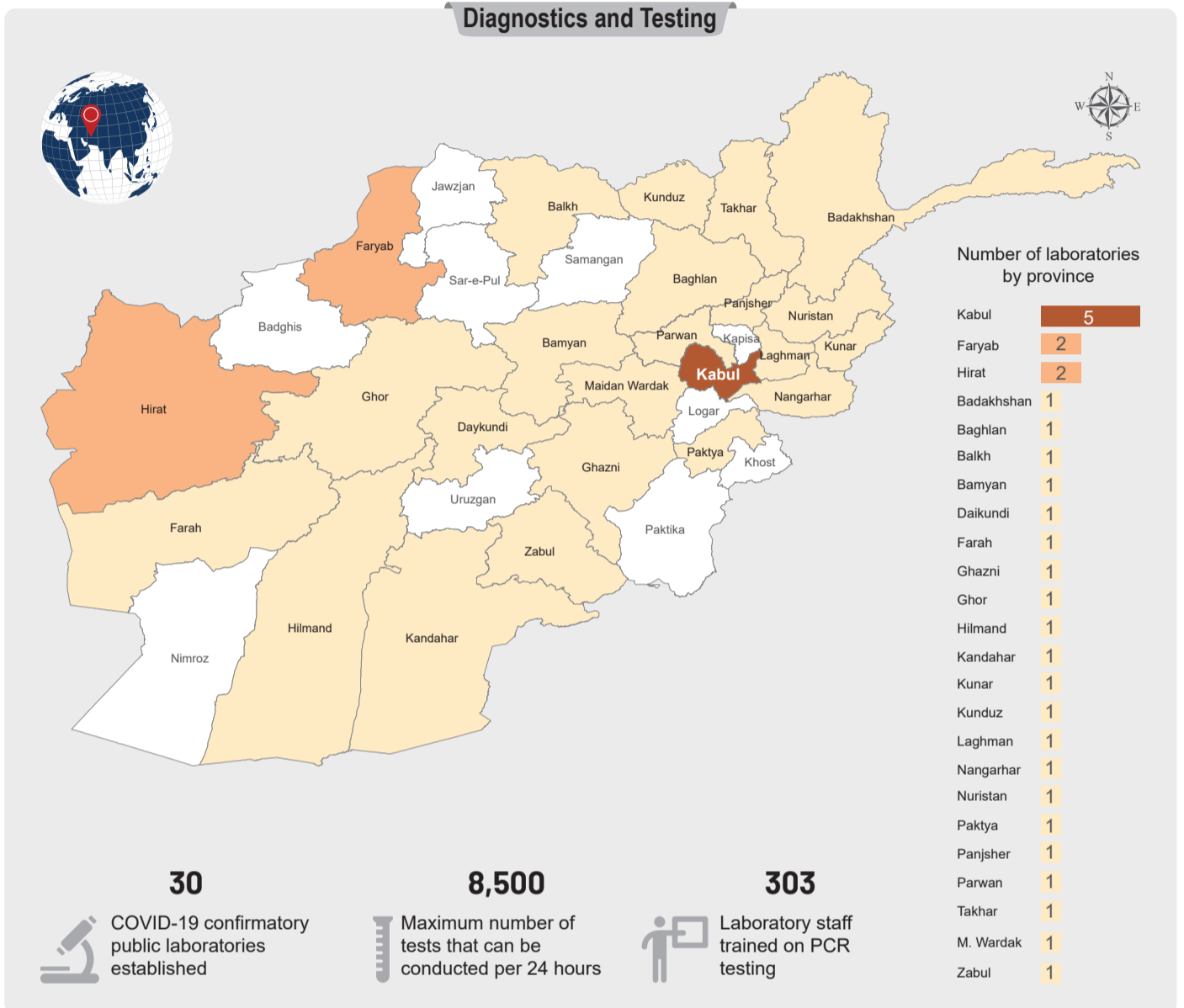

Surveillance and Reporting

921 Rapid Response Teams (RRTs) deployed for COVID-19 outbreak investigation across 34 provinces
245 RRTs provided ToTs on case investigation, specimen collection, health education and referrals
107,300 Suspected COVID-19 cases reported by the polio programme
337,324 Polio health workers, NGO and government staff trained on COVID-19 surveillance multiple times

Risk Communication and Community Engagement

270,118 Health workers and mobilisers oriented multiple times on delivering preventative messages
36 Banners on COVID-19 awareness and prevention installed at Kabul airport
8 Contact tracing staff provided basic RCCE training
 Collaboration with Gender Humanitarian Action Working Group to develop discussion guide to reduce women's hesitancy towards COVID-19 vaccine
 Tool to track people's perceptions on vaccines and health issues being developed
 Discussion guide for vaccine demand generation among detainees being developed in coordination with UNAMA
