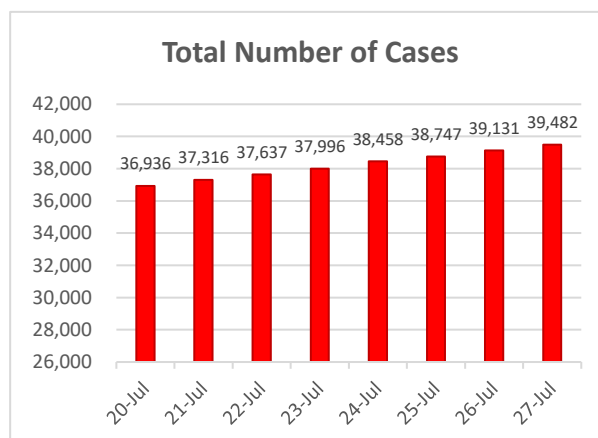
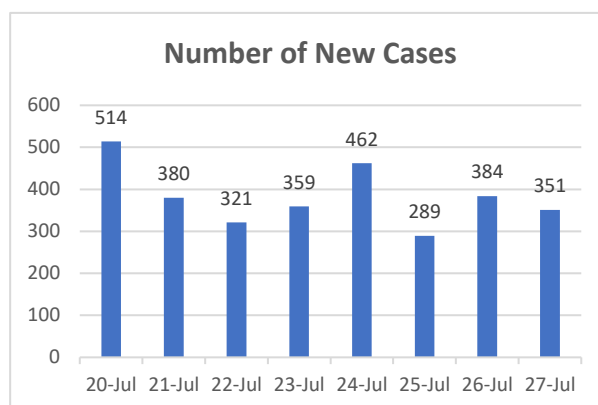

HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality was a 55 year old male expatriate.
- The Health Minister emphasised the need to refrain from family gatherings to avoid a surge in cases as witnessed earlier by the country soon after Eid Al Fitr.
- 3,000 locally made masks along with beverages were distributed by the Southern Governorate to migrant workers in an effort to increase awareness.
- Ministry of Education will give a choice to the parents between online classes and actual attendance when schools reopen in September.
