HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality was a 53 year old Female Bahraini Citizen.
- Ministry of Health stressed caution and public commitment in light of escalating number of COVID-19 cases amongst women and children during social and religious events.
- National Taskforce for Combating the Coronavirus clarified few directive points published in local newspapers.
- Civil Aviation Affairs at the Ministry of Telecommunications temporarily suspended travels to risky destinations to curb the spread of the novel coronavirus.
- Taking immediate measures to improve the efficiency of operations at the central store and the Salmaniya pharmacy.
- Ministry of Education carried out a training workshop on digital lessons for physical education.
- Minister of Labor announced terms of entitlement for the 50% payment of salaries to Bahraini citizens working in the private sector

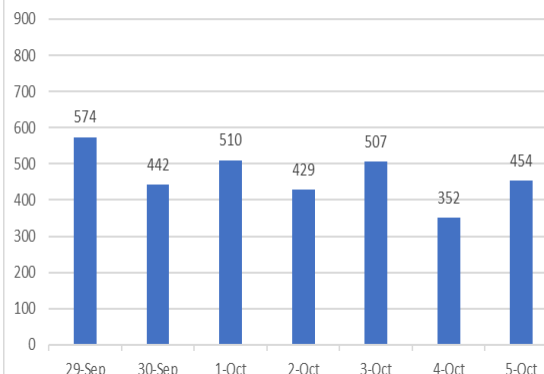

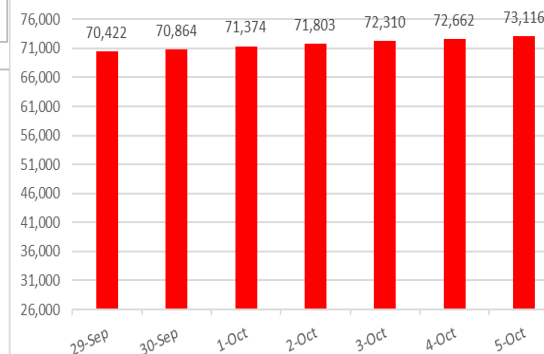
