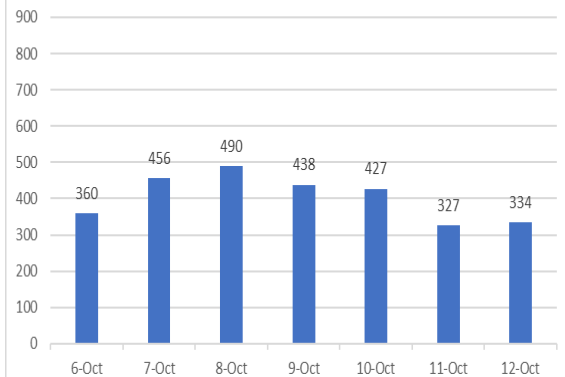

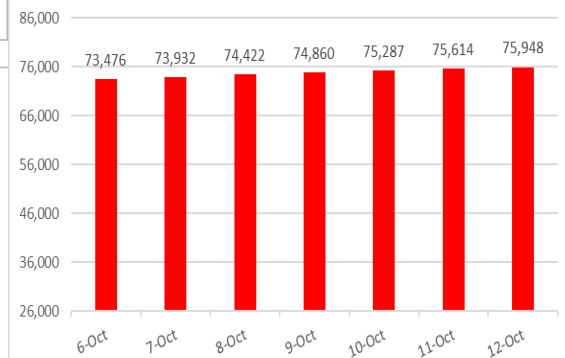
HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality were: 4 Bahraini Citizens [2 female (72 and 86 years old) and 2 male (61 and 63 years old)] and a 52 years old male expatriate.

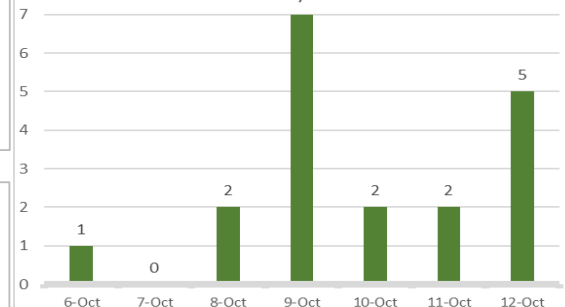
Number of New Cases
