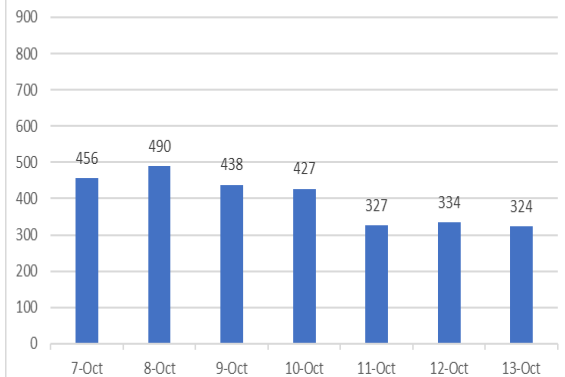

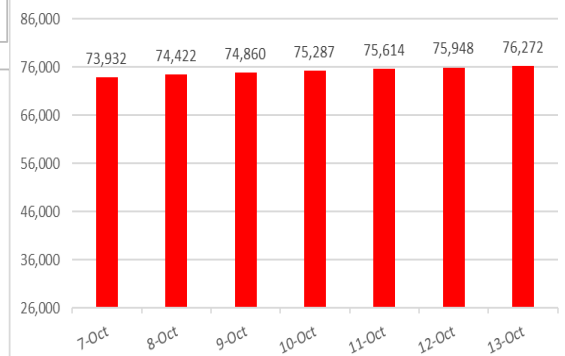
HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality were: 5 Bahraini Citizens [3 female (61, 66 and 80 years old) and 2 male (78 and 82 years old)].
- Including Bahrain, over 180 countries have committed to participate in the World Health Organization (WHO) effort to finance development and fair distribution of Covid-19 vaccines.
- Director General of the World Health Organization reiterated that the Covid-19 pandemic will be overcome quickly if countries enforced the right public health tools, otherwise may persist for a long time.
- The Crown Prince Center for Training and Medical Research earned the international accreditation certificate from the Society for Simulation in Healthcare (SSH).
- MPs called to open the Internet for free during the Covid-19 crisis to ensure students can log on to their online classes.
- MPs will continue holding Parliament's weekly Sessions remotely.
- Ministry of Information Affairs launched the electronic platform: "Bahrain TV and Radio" for broadcasting radio and television public health messages.

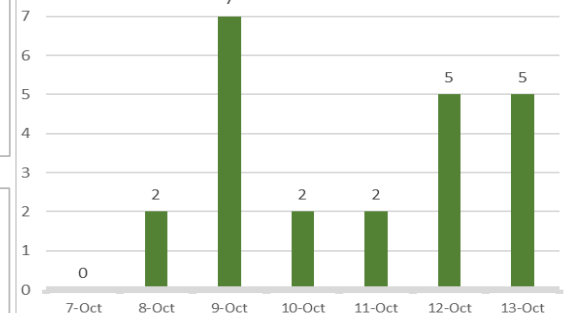
Number of New Cases
