HIGHLIGHTS

- The Mortality was a 55 year old male Bahraini citizens.

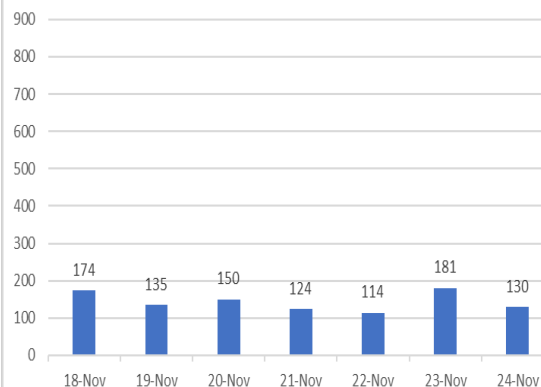

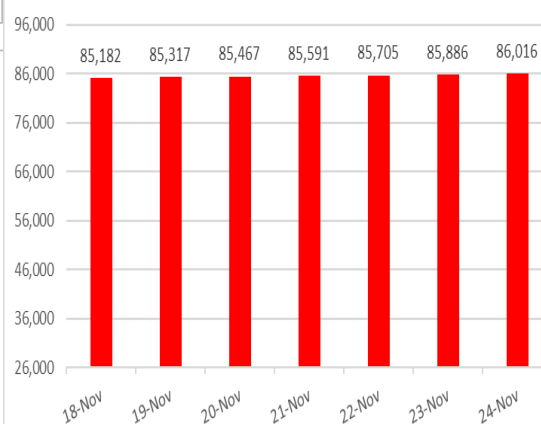
