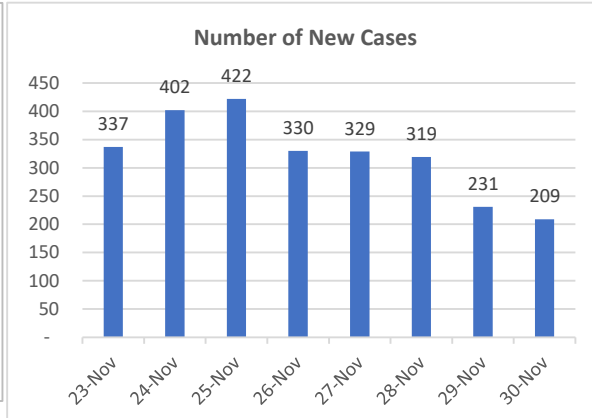

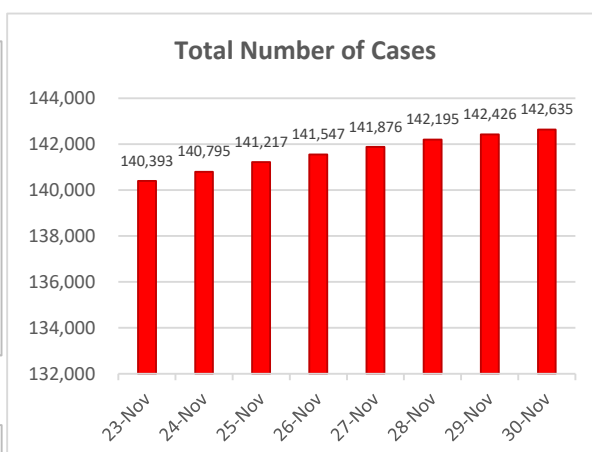
HIGHLIGHTS

- The government approves the direct return of domestic workers from the 34 banned countries starting from December 7th, returnees will have a mandatory quarantine of 2 weeks at a fixed fee of KD 270 (not including ticket fare) to be paid by the sponsor.
- Mandatory quarantine of returning health workers maintained at one week.
- Ministry of Interior provides an opportunity for residency violators to pay fines and rectify their status that spans the month of December.

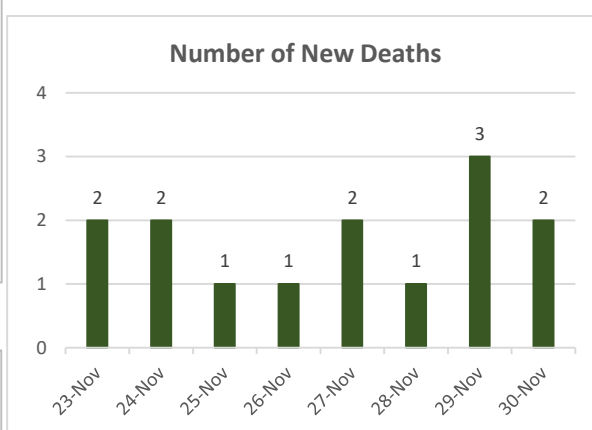
IMPORTANT DEFINITIONS

What is vaccination?

Vaccination is a simple, safe, and effective way of protecting people against harmful diseases, before they come into contact with them. It uses your body's natural defences to build resistance to specific infections and makes your immune system stronger.

Vaccines train your immune system to create antibodies, just as it does when it's exposed to a disease. However, because vaccines contain only killed or weakened forms of germs like viruses or bacteria, they do not cause the disease or put you at risk of its complications.

Most vaccines are given by an injection, but some are given orally (by mouth) or sprayed into the nose.
