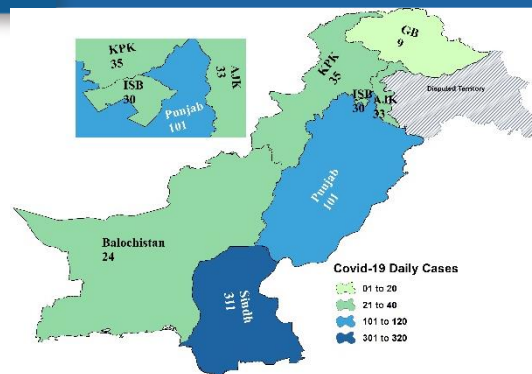

Executive Summary

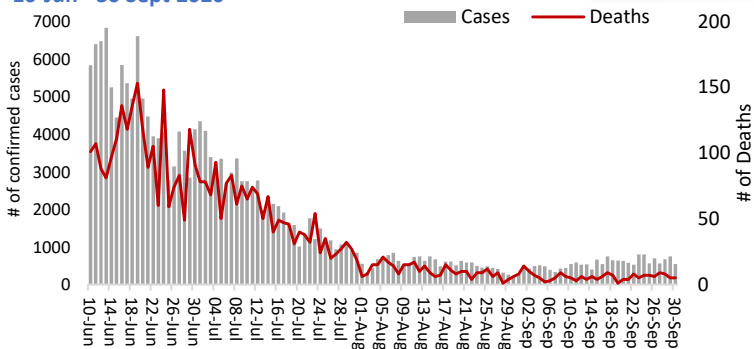
Pakistan reported **543** new cases of COVID-19 on **30 September 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **312,806** with **6,484** deaths (CFR: **2.07%**). Out of the total **8,825** currently active cases, **708** cases are hospitalized, out of which **490 (69.21%)** are in critical condition. **8,117** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **297,497 (95.11%)** have recovered and discharged.

Daily Incidence by Province



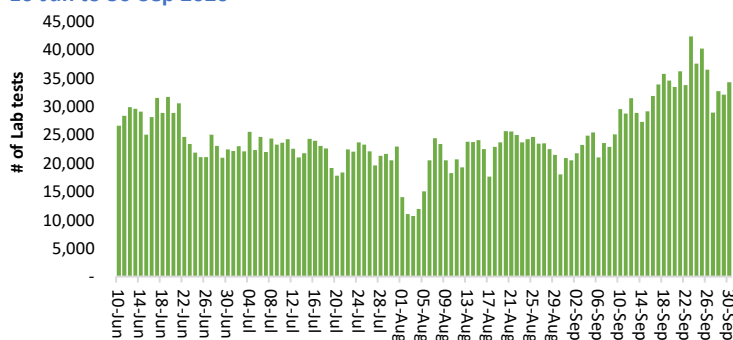
Daily Incidence/Mortality

10-Jun - 30 Sept 2020

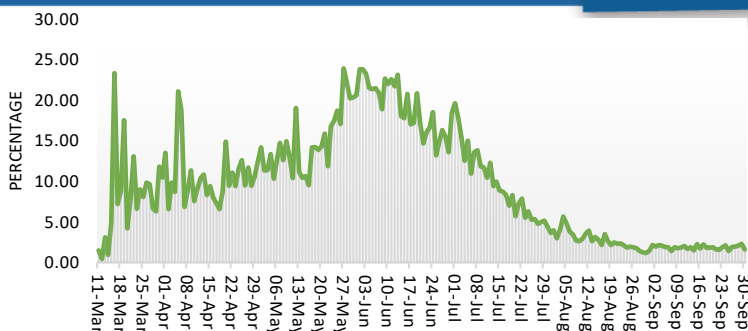


Daily Lab Test conducted

10-Jun to 30-Sep 2020

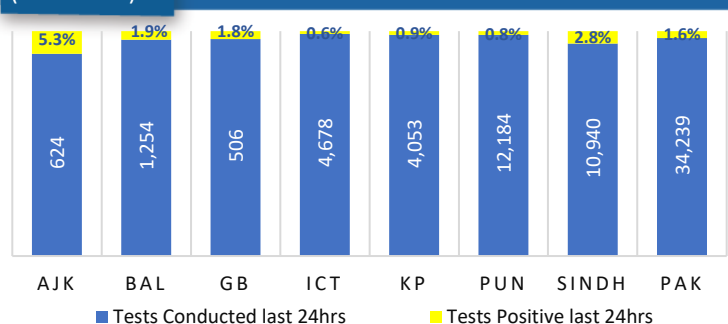


Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate

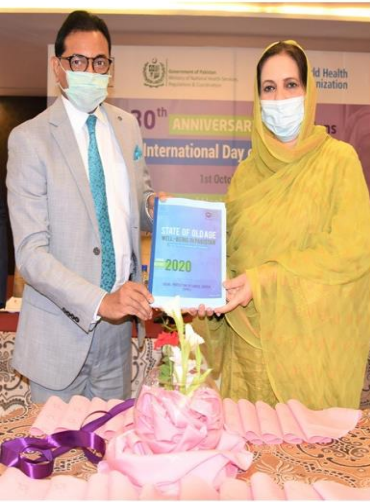

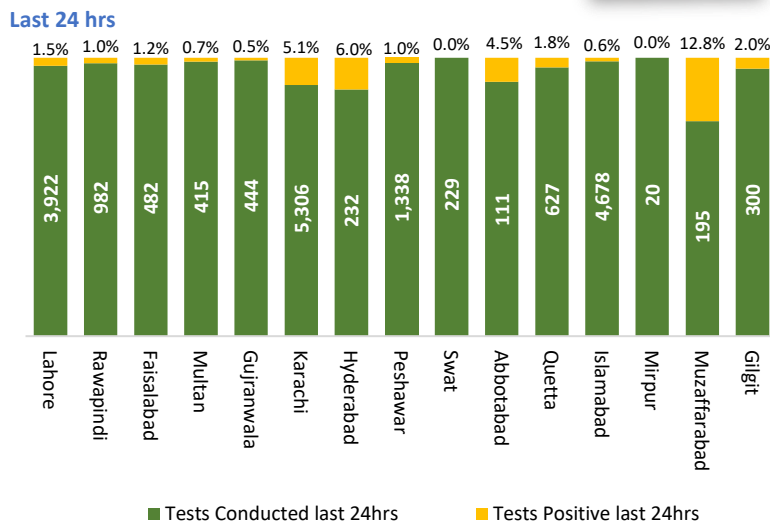
