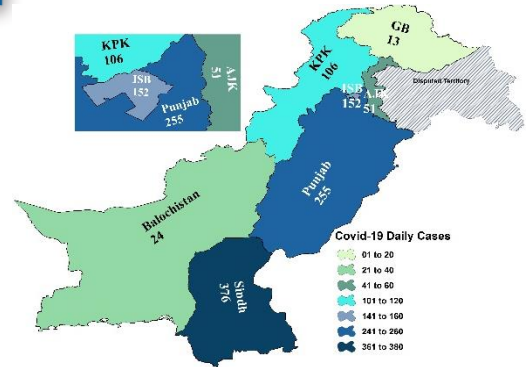

Executive Summary

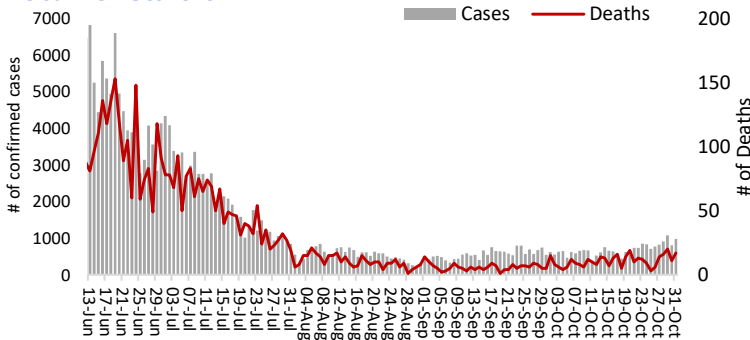
Pakistan reported **977** new cases of COVID-19 on **01 November 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **333,970** with **6,823** deaths (**CFR: 2.04%**). Out of the total **12,592** currently active cases, **821** cases are hospitalized, out of which **648 (78.93%)** are in critical condition. **11,771** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **314,555 (94.19%)** have recovered and discharged.

Daily Incidence by Province



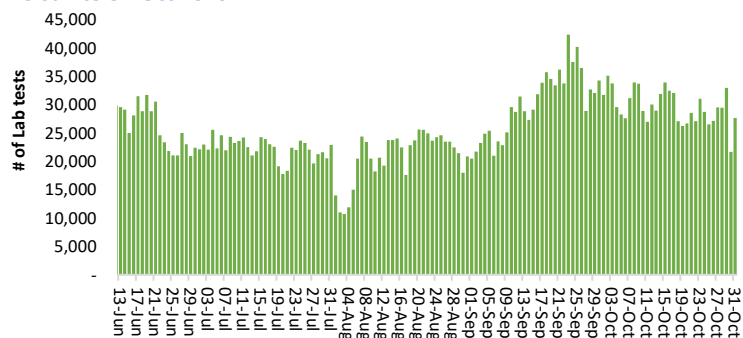
Daily Incidence/Mortality

13-Jun - 31-Oct 2020

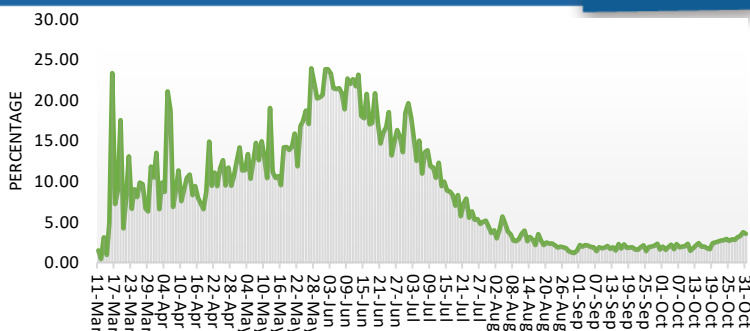


Daily Lab Tests conducted

13-Jun to 31-Oct 2020

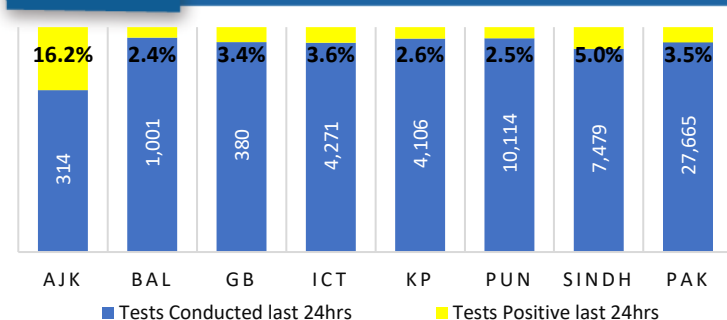


Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate

Meetings & Coordination

31 Service Providers including **22** health care providers (medical officers, women medical officers, gynaecologists and Medico-legal Professionals) and **09** service providers from Police Department (inspectors, sub-inspectors and lady constables) were trained on multi-sectoral response to GBV survivors.

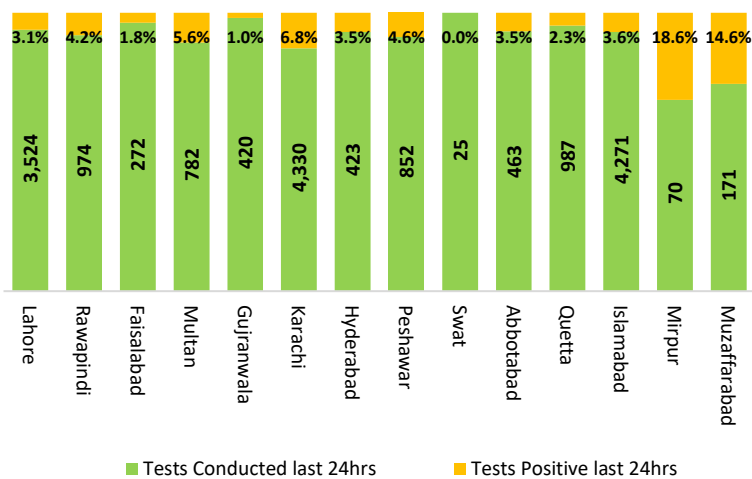
The training aimed to develop skills of the service providers and improve facility-based service delivery readiness environment, based on Nationally endorsed GBV health response package including clinical handbook for the provision of survivor centered health and clinical care; psycho-social support and referral services to GBV survivors.



Three days training was conducted from 21-23 October 2020 in Lahore for Lahore, Gujranwala and Kasur districts. These districts were targeted due to high burden of COVID-19 cases as well as reported cases of Gender Based Violence (GBV) including sexual violence during COVID-19 pandemic. The training was conducted under WHO and UNFPA partnership.
