On 2nd December 2021, Indus Hospital & Health Network in collaboration with World Health Organization Pakistan conducted the 1st Annual National Patient Safety Conference. WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala attended the inaugural session virtually. Parliamentary Secretary for Health/ Advisor to Chief Minister Sindh on Health Dr Qasim Soomro, Provincial Health Minister Balochistan Syed Ehsan Shah, Chief Executive Officer Indus Hospital and Health Network Dr Abdul Bari also attended the conference. Over 100 representatives from various public and private healthcare organizations from all the provinces attended the conference and deliberated on the patient safety challenges and solving them through innovative approaches.

In his inaugural speech, Dr Palitha stated that We are committed to making Patient safety as a priority in health sector policies and programs in Pakistan and is an essential component for strengthening health care systems to achieve Universal Health Coverage (UHC). Dr Qasim appreciated the WHO's collaboration with Federal and provincial ministries of health on different initiatives and national strategies that would help improve quality of care and expand patient safety to primary care level and engaging communities.
