

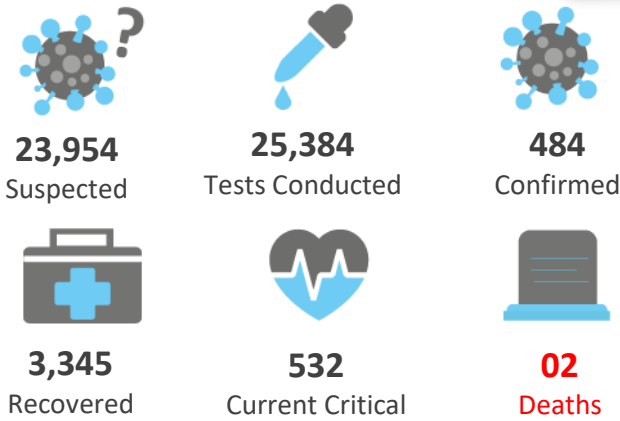

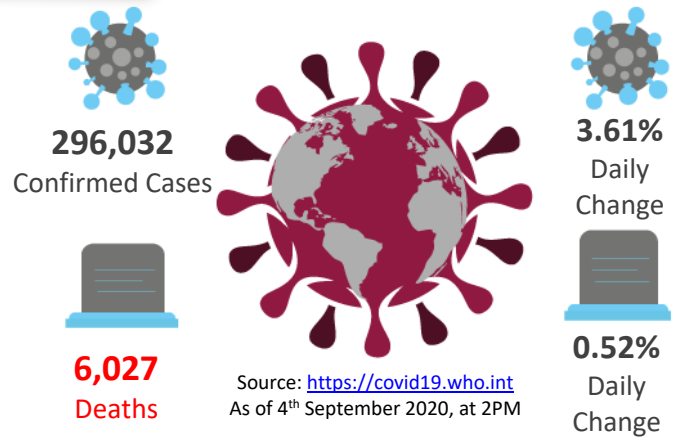

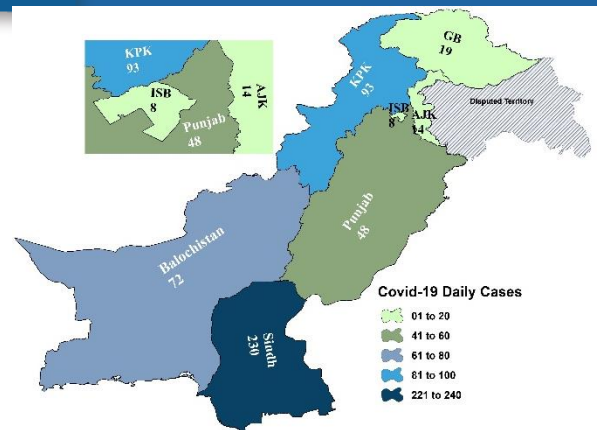

### Executive Summary

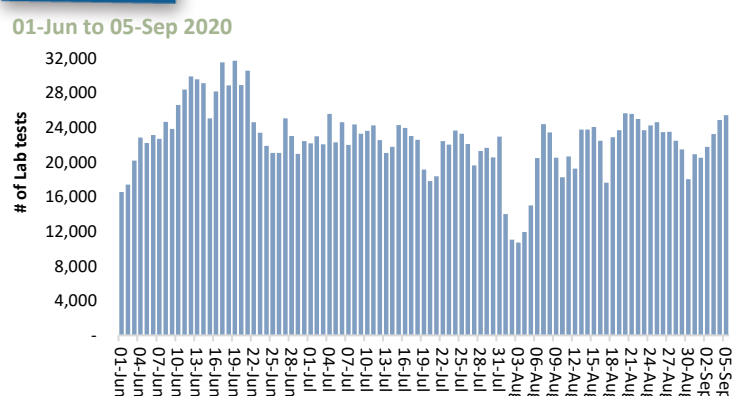
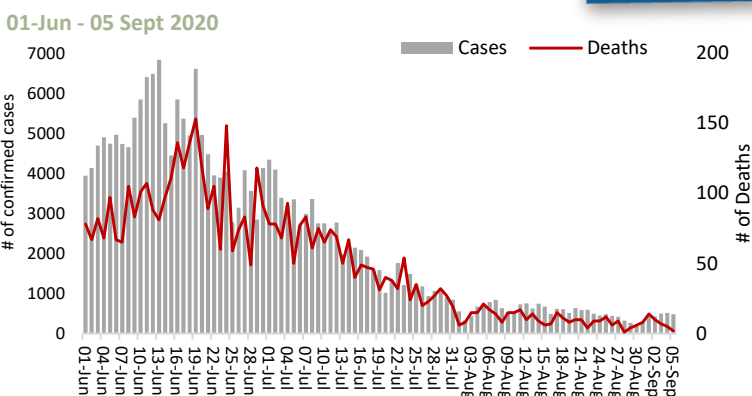
### Daily Incidence by Province

Pakistan reported **484** new cases of COVID-19 on **5 September 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **298,509** with **6,342** deaths (**CFR: 2.12%**). Out of the total **9,132** currently active cases, **1,025** cases are hospitalized, out of which **532 (51.90%)** are in critical condition. **5,244** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **285,898 (95.77%)** have recovered and discharged.

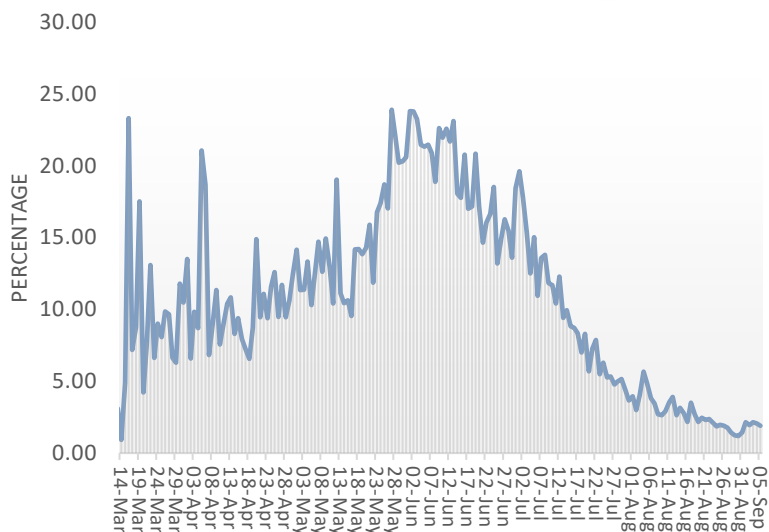

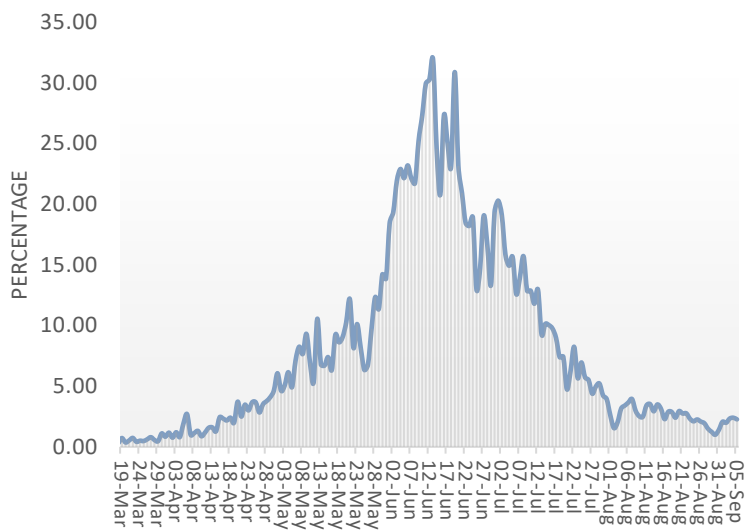

## Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate

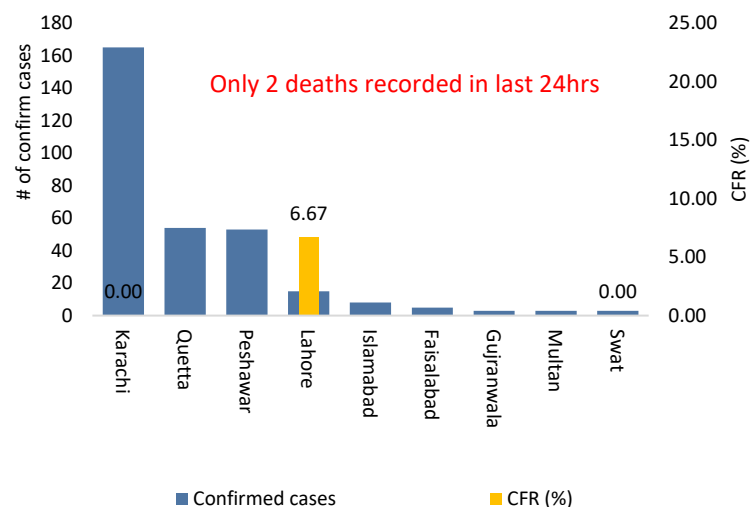


## Daily COVID-19 Attack rate Per million population



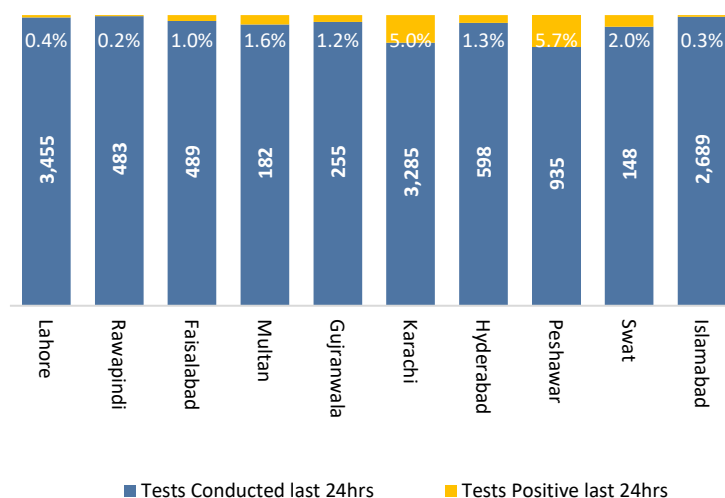
## COVID-19 Confirmed cases & CFR by Major Cities / Districts

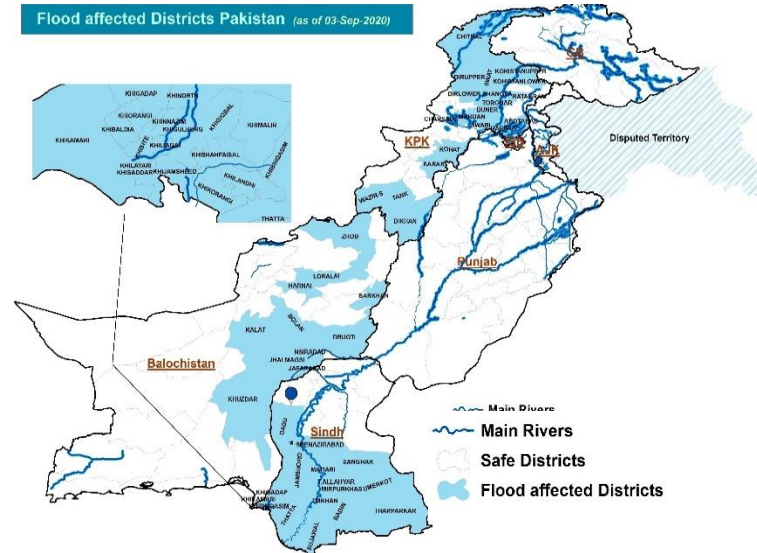
# FLOOD SITUATION

Sunday, 6<sup>th</sup> September 2020

In Pakistan, (4<sup>th</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> September 2020) heavy rains & floods in many parts of the country resulting into partial damage to 209 houses, full damage to at least 19 houses, 11 people injured and 14 deaths. According to NDMA. Most of the impact of the rains and floods occurred in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province (4<sup>th</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> September) which recorded 8 injuries, 14 people dead 19 houses fully and 209 houses partially damaged.

To date over **245 deaths**, over **166 Injuries** have been recorded as a result of heavy rains and floods. Over, 1,359 houses fully and 1,249 partially damaged since 15<sup>th</sup> June. See the table below for details.

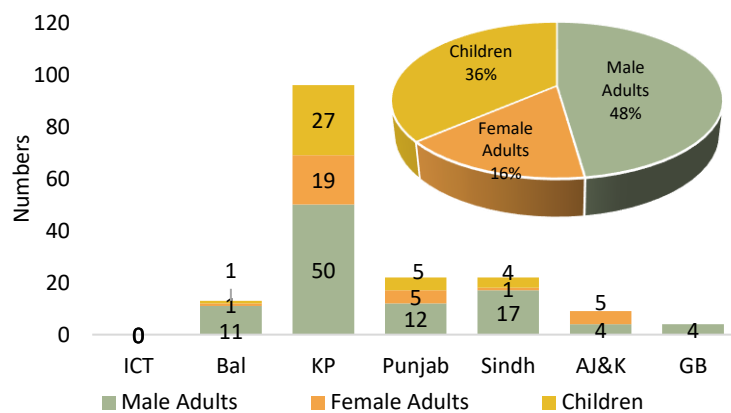

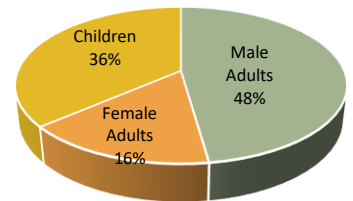
