



#### **INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE**




#### **TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.**




Pakistan reported **1,346** new cases of COVID-19 on **6**<sup>th</sup> **February 2021**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **554,474** with **11,967** deaths **(CFR: 2.16%).** Out of the total **32,265** currently active cases **2,295** cases are hospitalized.

#### **MEETINGS & COORDINATION**

On 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2021, WHO Pakistan in collaboration with the Provincial health Department Balochistan conducted a one-day training on Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI) and Influenza Like Illness (ILI) Sentinel surveillance. The training was conducted at the District Head Quarter Hospital (DHQ) Kalat, Khuzdar Division. A total 20 Sentinel site Focal persons attended the training. The objective of the training was to train Health Care providers on detecting SARI/ILI cases and testing them for COVID-19.

The Kalat District Health Officer Dr Nasrullah, Medical Superintendent DHQ hospital Kalat Dr Ali Akbar and the District Support Manager President's Primary Health Care Initiative Mr Abdul Qadeer, attended the concluding session. During his speech, Dr Nasrullah assured the participants of their full support in the implementation of SARI/ILI sentinel surveillance.
