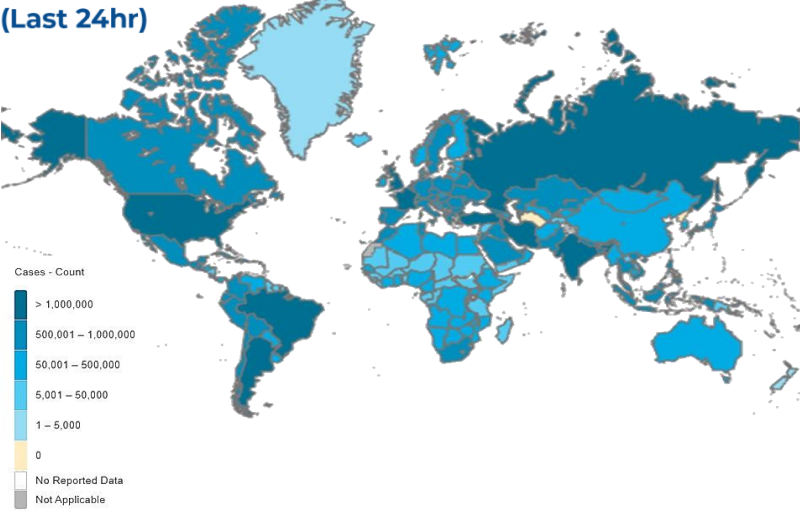
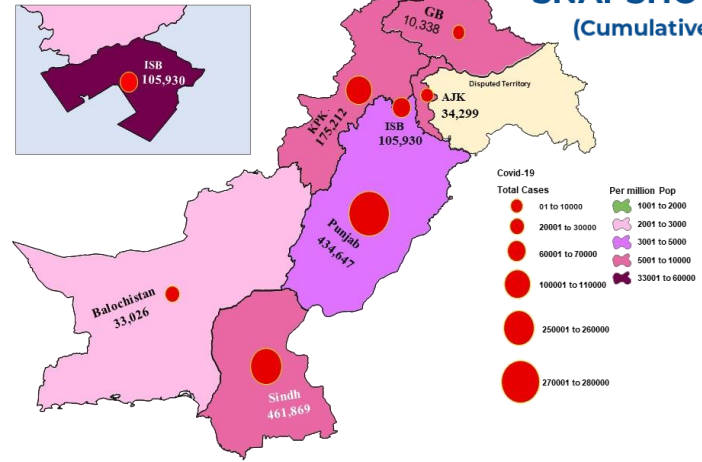

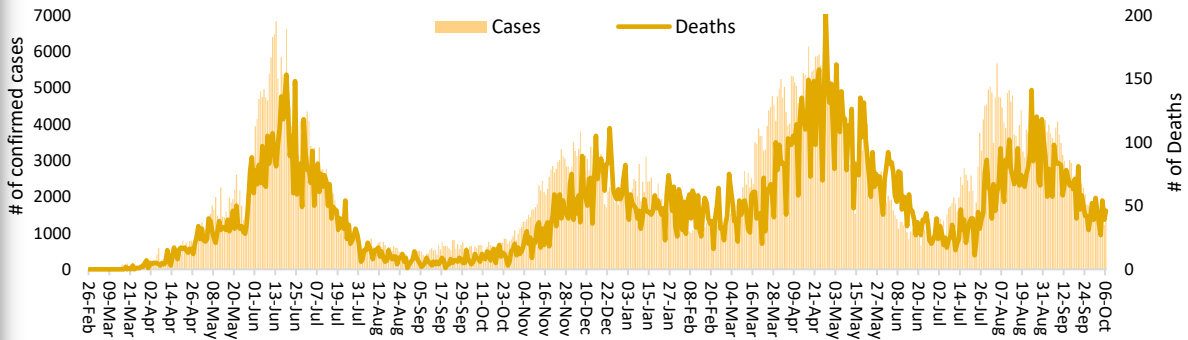

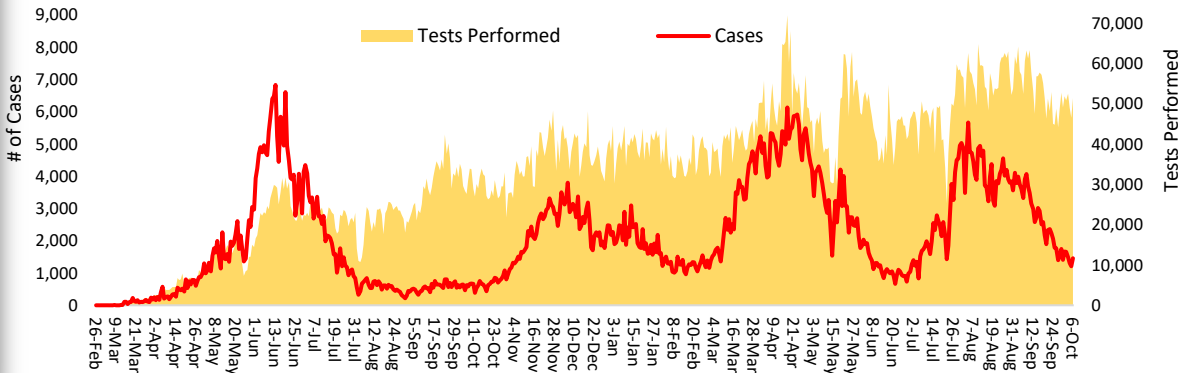

The Primary & Secondary Healthcare Department, Punjab in collaboration with World Health Organization, Pakistan is conducting a one-month training on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) at hotel one, Lahore from 27th September to 18th October 2021. The course is based on standardized IPC curriculum for nurses. On the 6th October 2021, WHO Country Representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala and the Director General Nursing Punjab Mrs. Shahnaz Ayub graced the official opening ceremony. A total of 20 nurses drawn from DHQ and THQ hospitals across Punjab Province are attending the training. It is envisaged that the graduate trainees will cascade the IPC knowledge to other health workers within their facilities. Speaking on behalf of the DGHS Punjab, Dr Mohammad Sohail appreciated WHO Pakistan support to the training, that he noted will go a long way in improving IPC standards and practice in the Public hospitals.
