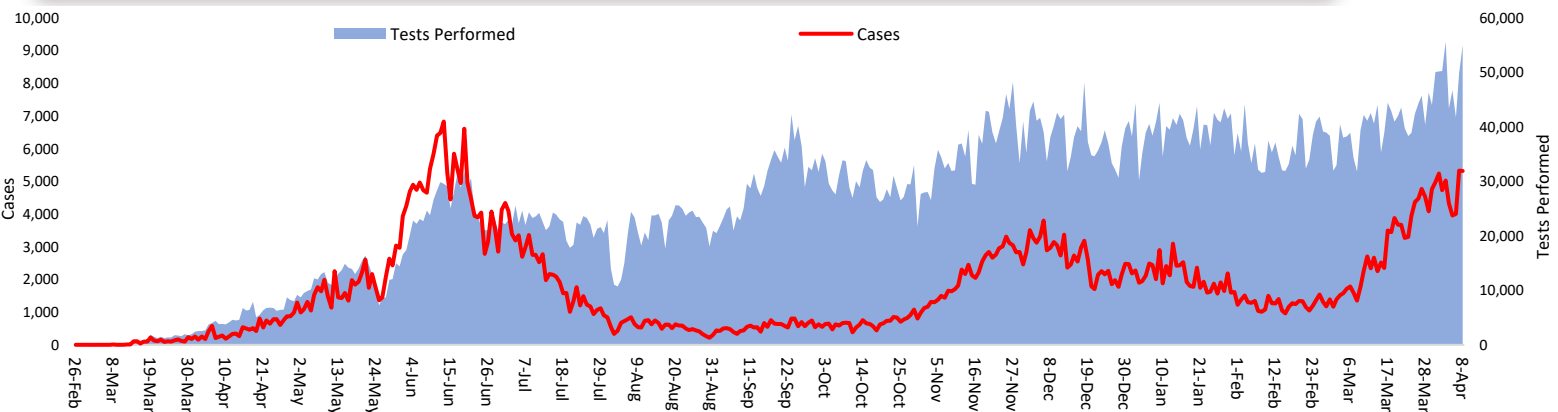
## PAKISTAN COVID-19 SNAPSHOT (Cumulative)

## MEETING AND COORDINATION

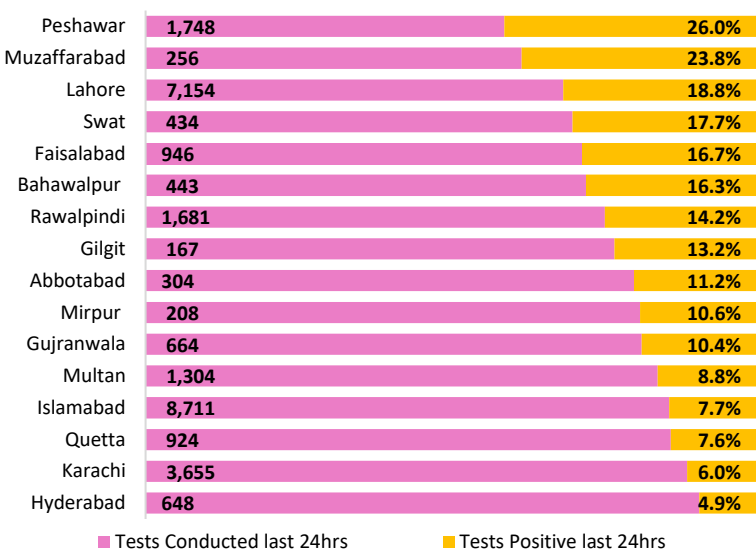

On 8<sup>th</sup> April 2021, WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala participated in a Webinar to commemorate the World Health Day. The webinar was moderated by Chief Executive Officer, Greenstar Social Marketing Dr Syed Azizur Rab. The Honourable First Lady of Pakistan, Begum Samina Alvi was the Chief Guest. Panellists to the webinar were: Technical Director, Sehat Sahulat Programme, Dr. Muhammed Arshad and Board Chairperson, Greenstar Social Marketing, Dr Rehana Ahmed. During the discussion, Dr Palitha informed the meeting that World Health Day 2021 is being commemorated under the theme “Building a fairer, healthier world.” Dr Palitha highlighted examples of inequities in health care system which included access to COVID-19 test kits, PPEs and now vaccines for low income countries. He also talked about inequity in deployment of human resources in urban as compared to rural. He suggested that there is need to address the social and economic determinants of health across sectors, accelerating progress towards UHC and protecting individuals from financial hardships in accessing health care. He finally called upon the Government of Pakistan, development partners, civil society, communities, and other stakeholders to intensify efforts to achieve UHC, and to invest in health, to tackle inequities and build a fairer, healthier world.

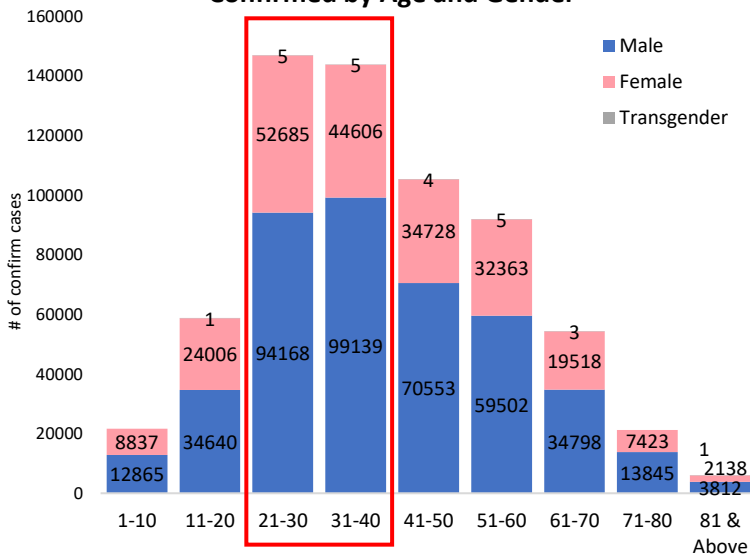

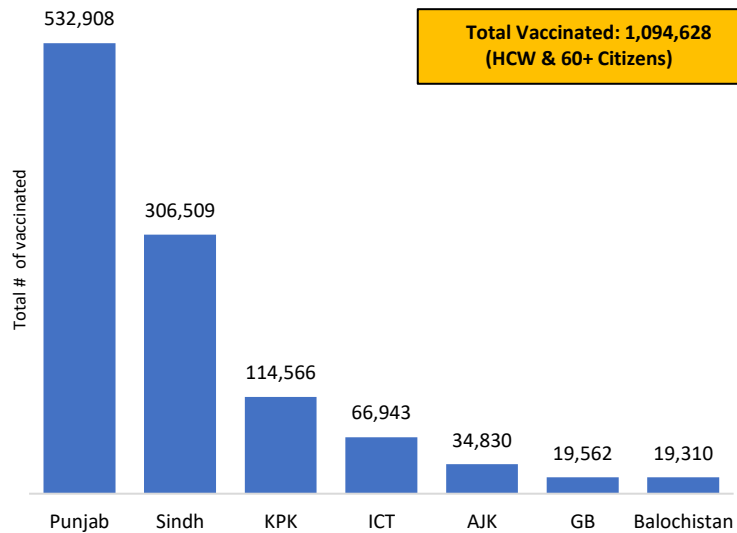

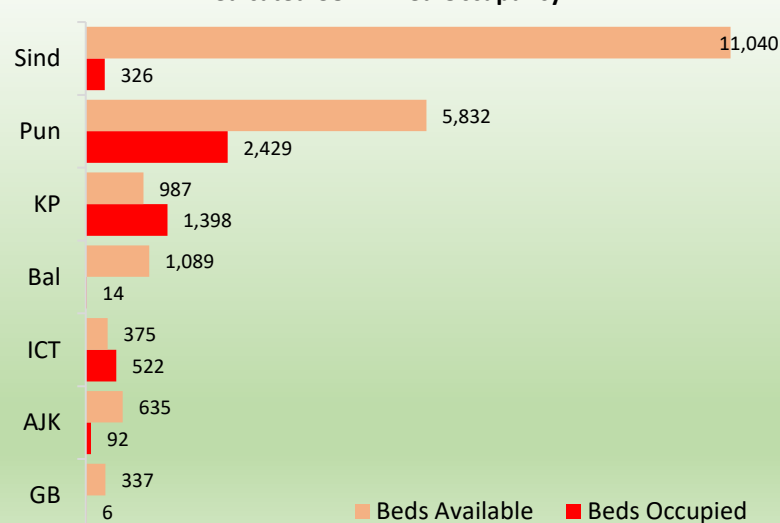


Status of Vaccination

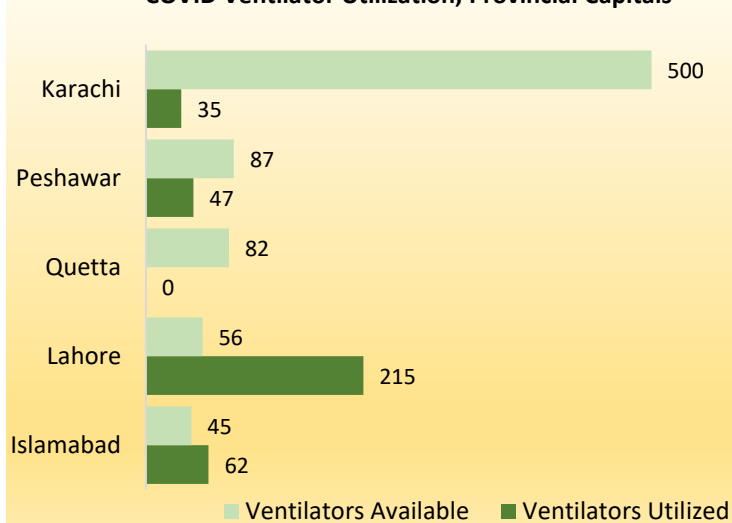


## Health System Capacity
