





INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE




TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.




Pakistan reported **2,963** new cases of COVID-19 on **08 December 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **426,142** with **8,547** deaths **(CFR: 2.00%).** Out of the total **45,324** currently active cases **3,030** cases are hospitalized.

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

Today, 9th December 2020, WHO country representative in Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala and Parliamentary Secretary for Health, Dr Nausheen Hamid launched Strengthening PHC initiative for TB free Islamabad. The initiative is a broadspectrum approach for TB free Islamabad. The package supported by WHO Pakistan includes the legislative umbrella of Mandatory TB notification, improving identification of presumptive TB in primary care and communities, Improving referrals and specimen transportation, strengthening TB DOTS linkages in tertiary care, initiating TB preventive treatment, Community engagement by Involvement of Lady Health Workers (LHWs) and Involving private sector and capacity building of health care workers. The initiative compliments maintaining the essential TB service DURING COVID-19 EPIDEMIC. Dr Palitha while speaking on the occasion reiterated WHO support for Ending TB in Pakistan. Dr Nausheen Hamid in her remarks said that ending TB is a key priority of the Government and thanked WHO for extending support.
