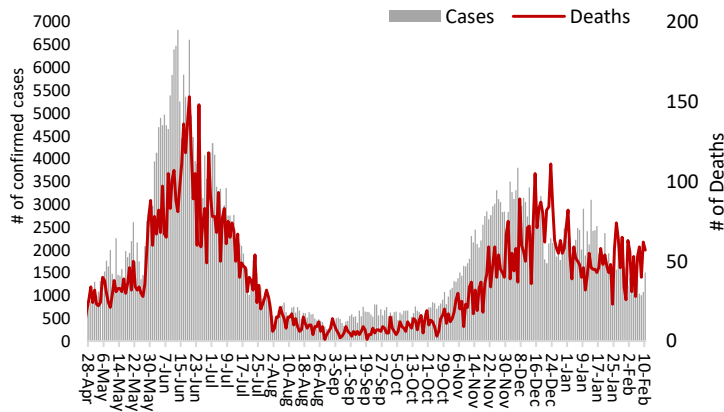

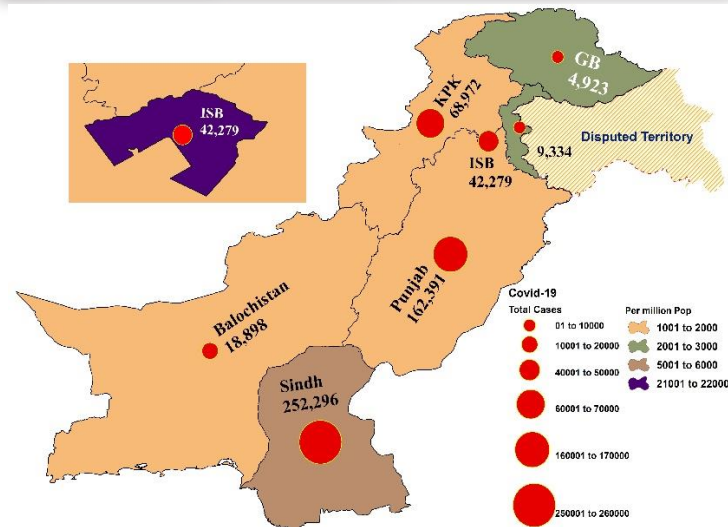


INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE

28-April 2020 - 10- Feb 2021



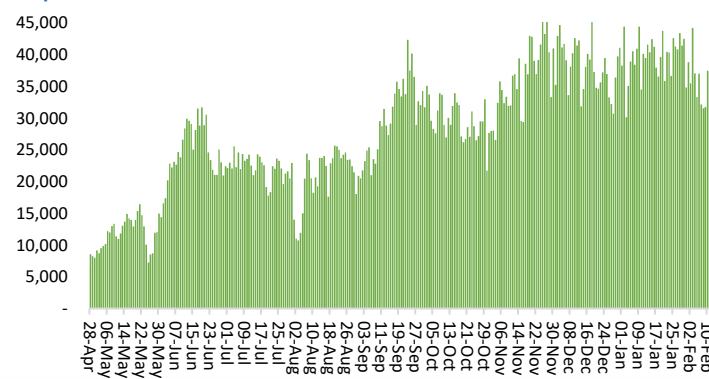
TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.



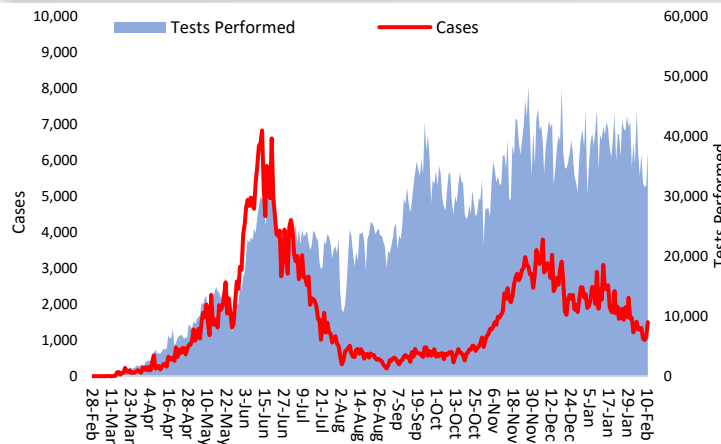
Pakistan reported **1,502** new cases of COVID-19 on **10th February 2021**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **559,093** with **12,185** deaths (**CFR: 2.18%**). Out of the total **30,225** currently active cases **2,189** cases are hospitalized.

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

On 9th February 2021, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with the Ministry of National Health Services Regulations and Coordination (MONHSR&C), conducted a meeting with the technical working group for priority setting in public health research. The meeting was co-chaired by Acting Office-In-charge, Dr Michael Lukwiya and Deputy Director, MONHSR&C, Dr Sabeen Afzal, at Ramada hotel Islamabad. The technical working group agreed on methodology and criteria for setting priorities for public health research. Four broader themes including communicable diseases, Non-Communicable Diseases, injuries, Health services and systems and RMNCH were agreed for priority setting. During the meeting Dr Sabeen stated that this exercise will help in creating harmony among policy makers and researchers, and resource mobilization to promote research in key priority areas. Acting Office-Incharge WHO, Dr Michael assured support to the government and all partners for promotion of public health research in Pakistan.
