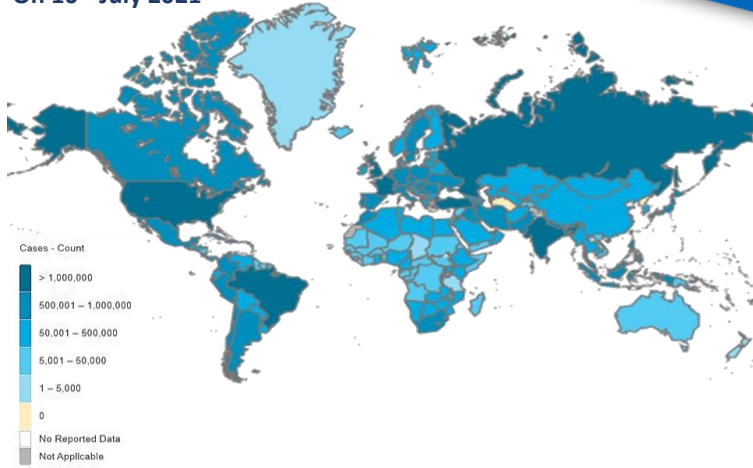

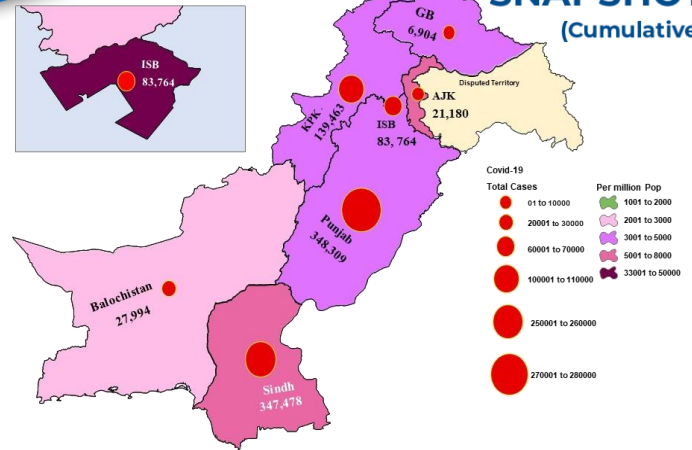

## PAKISTAN COVID-19 SNAPSHOT (Cumulative)

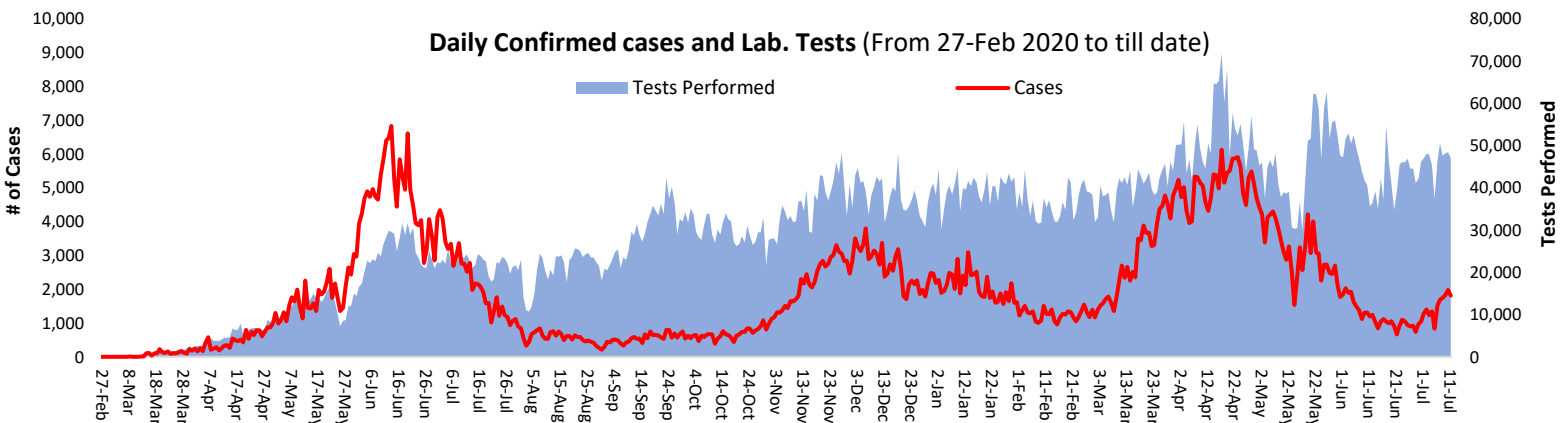
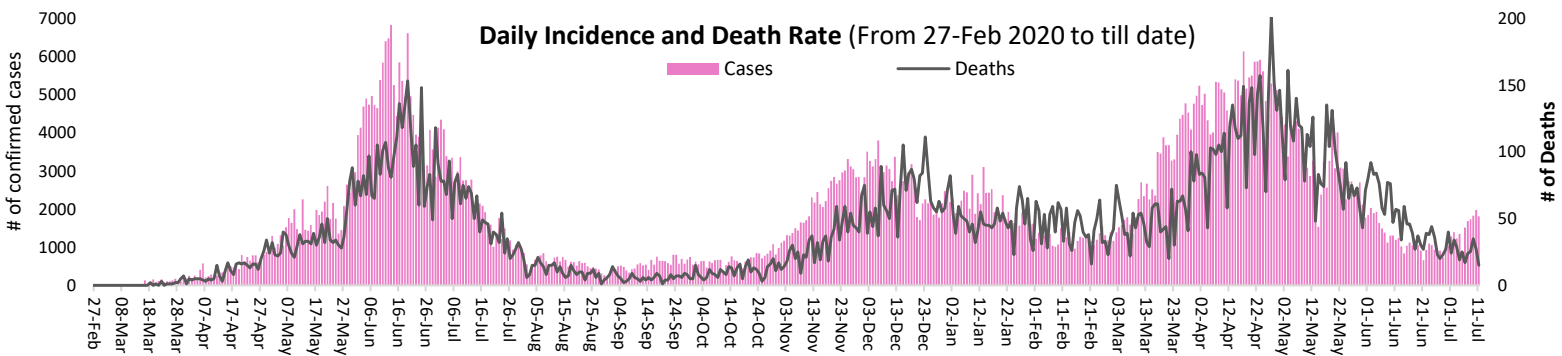

## Meeting and Coordination



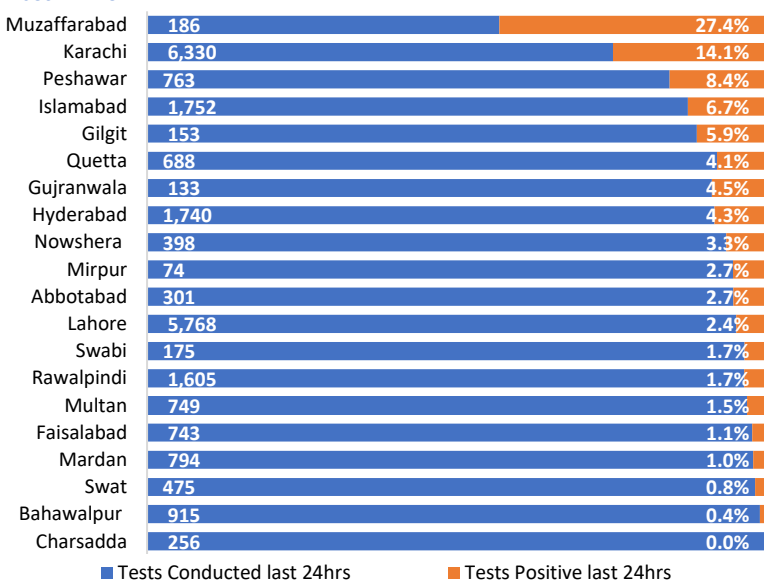
On 9<sup>th</sup> July 2021, the National Institute of Health, Pakistan and Punjab Primary and Secondary Health Care Department in collaboration with World Health Organization (WHO), Pakistan conducted a training on COVID-19 Laboratory Diagnostic Methods at Provincial Public Health Lab, Punjab AIDS Control Program, Lahore.

The training was organized to build capacity of Molecular Biologists and Senior Laboratory Technologists on WHO recommended protocols for COVID-19 Laboratory diagnostic tests. A total of 26 participants from 18 COVID-19 testing laboratories across Punjab participated in the training.

During the closing session, the Additional Secretary Technical, Dr Asim Altaf appreciated WHO for the supporting the training. He stated that the training will go a long way in strengthening COVID19 response in Punjab.
