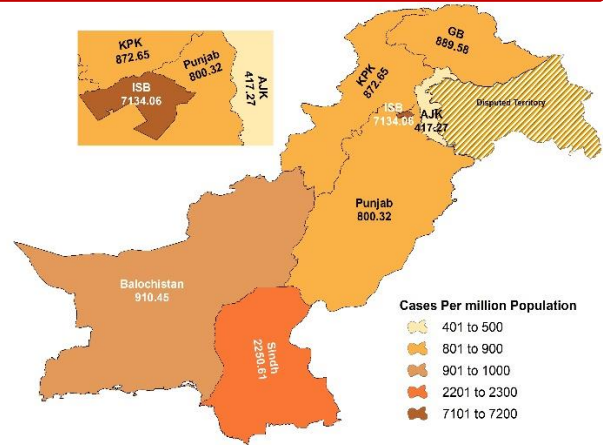

### COVID-19 case density/million Population

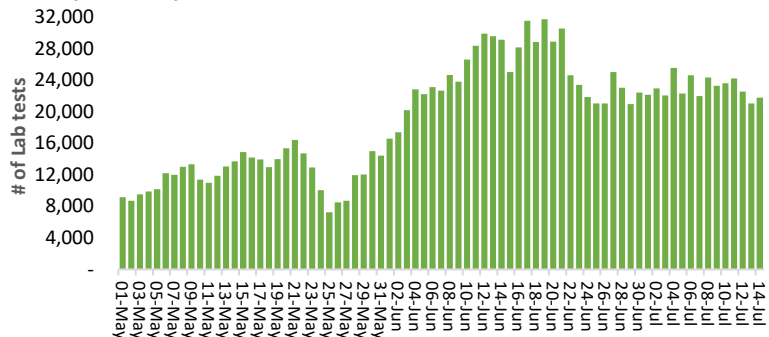


### Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **2,165** new cases of COVID-19 on **14 July 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **255,769** with **5,386** deaths (**CFR: 2.10%**). Out of the total **78,392** currently active cases, **3,727** cases are hospitalized, out of which **1,778 (47.70%)** are in critical condition. **74,665** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **172,810 (67.56%)** have recovered and discharged.

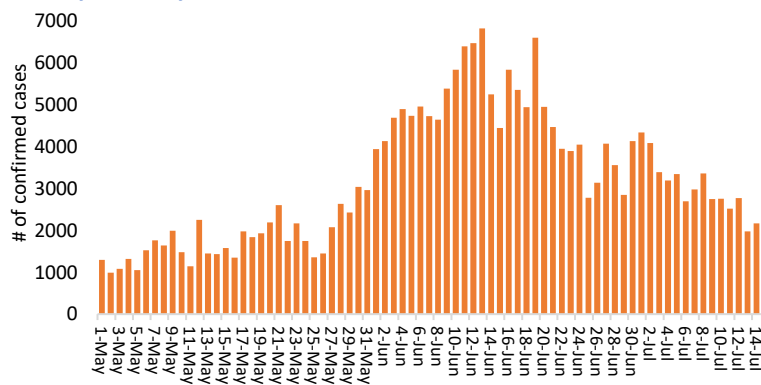
### Daily Lab tests conducted in Pakistan

01 May to 14 July 2020



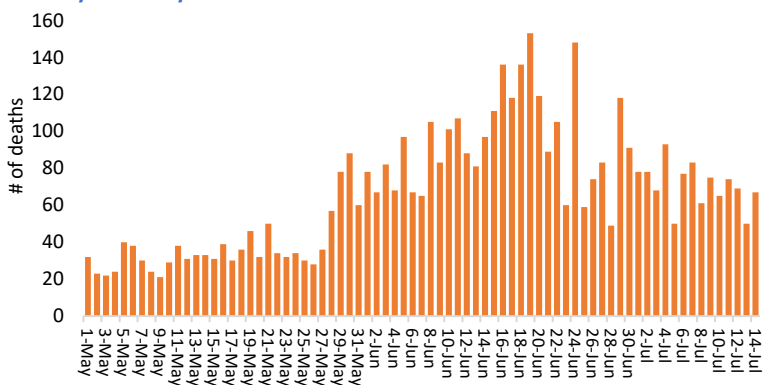
### Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan

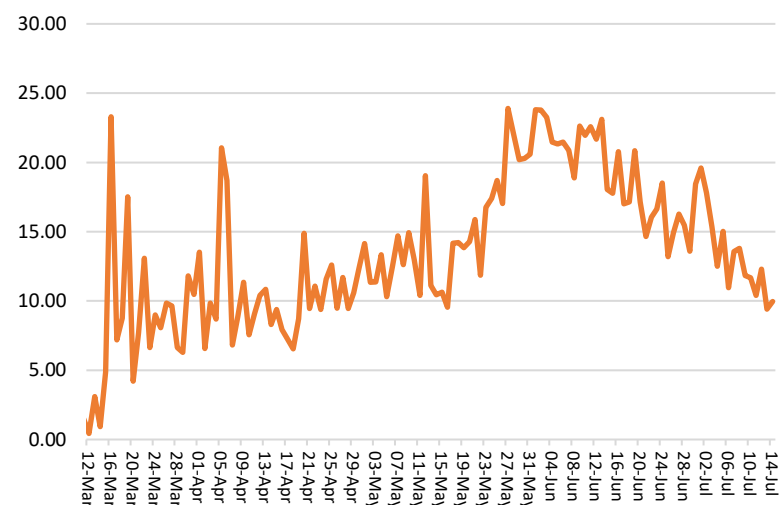

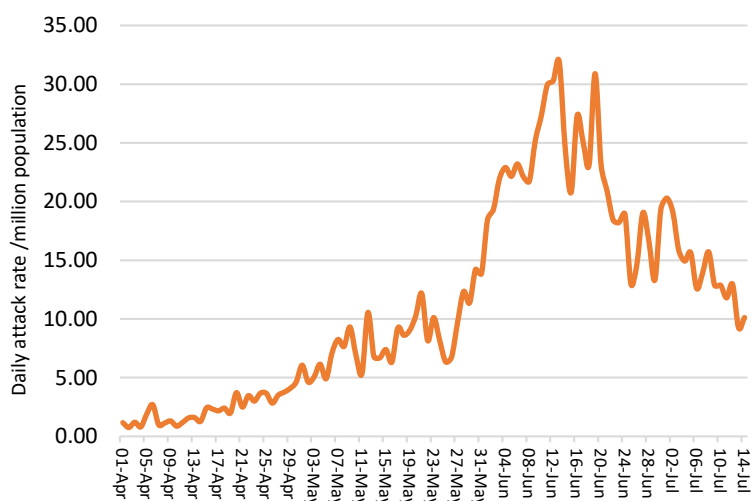
## Meeting & Coordination

Today, 15<sup>th</sup> July 2020, World Health Organization, Pakistan organized the UN Infection Prevention and Control Technical Working Group (TWG) virtual meeting. Dr Palitha Mahipala, WHO country representative, Pakistan chaired the meeting. Dr Mumtaz Ali Khan, National IPC Focal Person from National Institute of Health, Ministry of National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination joined the virtual meeting at WHO country office, Islamabad. The main objectives of the meeting were to update the members on Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) activities for COVID-19 response, enhance coordination and sharing preliminary findings of the Hospital readiness assessment. 18 members of the TWG including representatives from (UNICEF, UNFPA, UN-Habitat & ICRC) participated in the meeting.

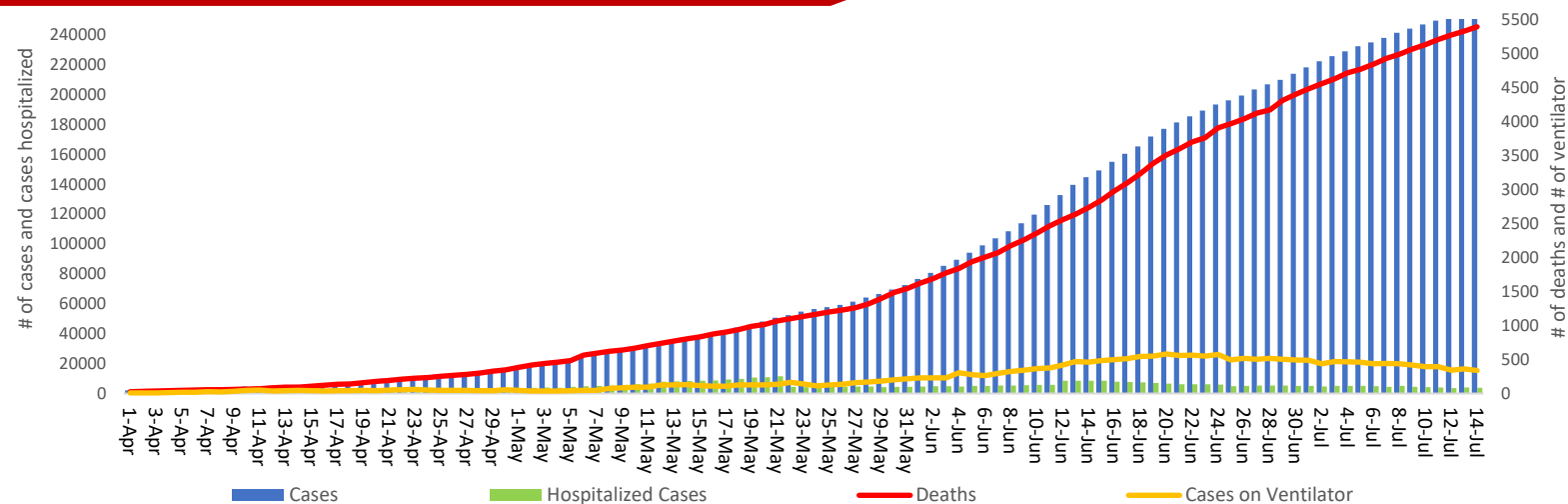
## Daily Positivity rate in Pakistan



## Daily Attack rate/million population



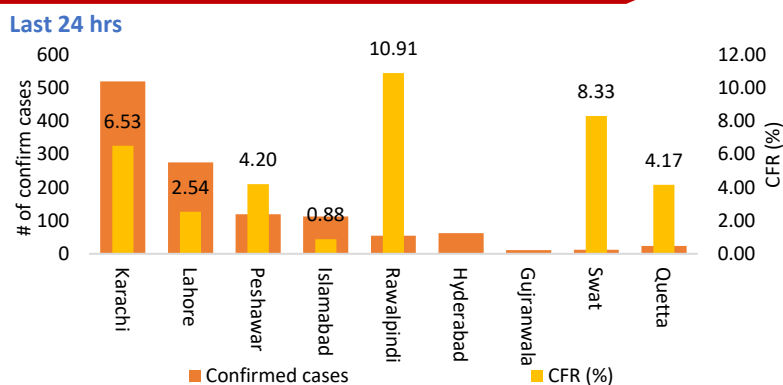
## Trends of COVID-19 cases, hospitalized, on ventilator & Deaths



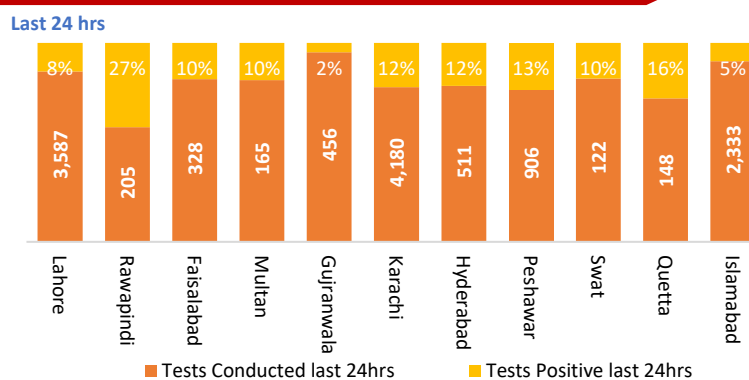

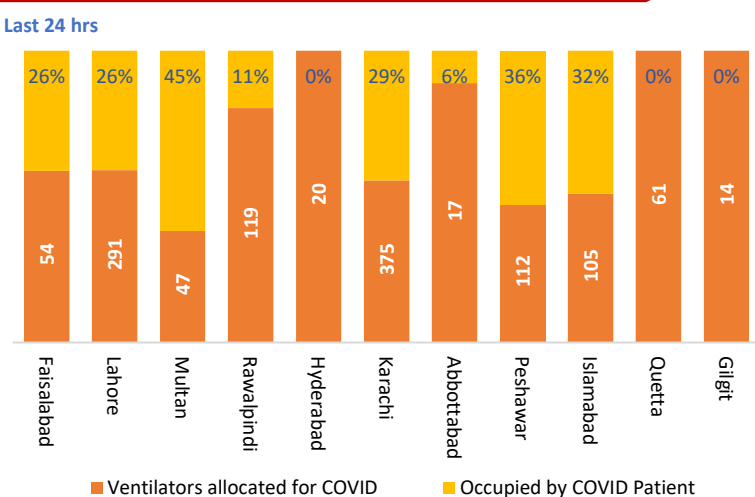
## COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
