

Executive Summary


Pakistan reported **659** new cases of COVID-19 on **15 October 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **321,877** with **6,621** deaths (**CFR: 2.06%**). Out of the total **9,421** currently active cases, **780** cases are hospitalized, out of which **529** (**67.82%**) are in critical condition. **8,641** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **305,835** (**95.02%**) have recovered and discharged.

Daily Incidence by Province




Daily Incidence/Mortality

13-Jun - 15-Oct 2020




Daily Lab Tests conducted




Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate


