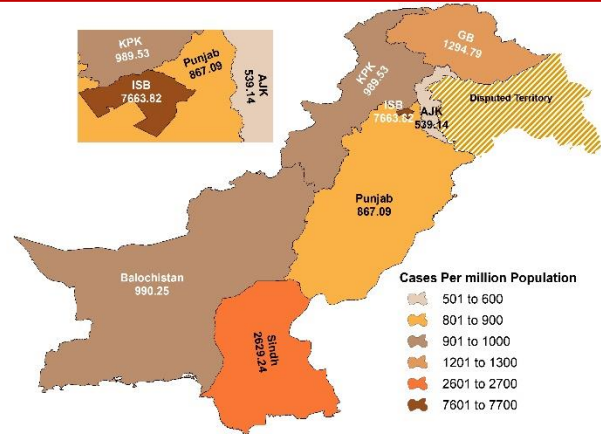

COVID-19 case density/million Population

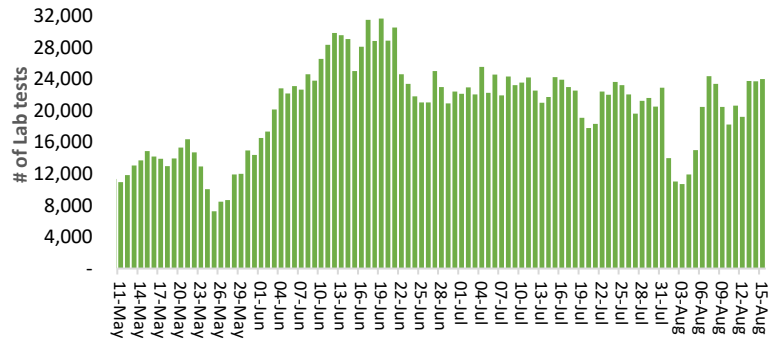


Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **670** new cases of COVID-19 on **15 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **288,717** with **6,168** deaths (CFR: **2.13%**). Out of the total **16,248** currently active cases, **1,308** cases are hospitalized, out of which **769** (**58.79%**) are in critical condition. **14,940** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **266,301** (**92.23%**) have recovered and discharged.

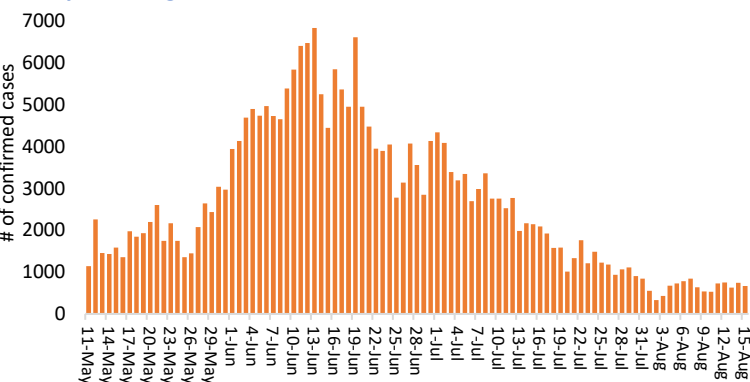
Daily Lab tests conducted in Pakistan

10 May to 15 Aug 2020



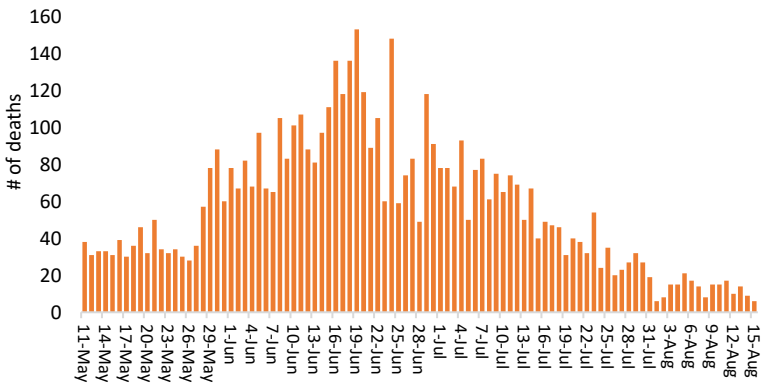
Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan

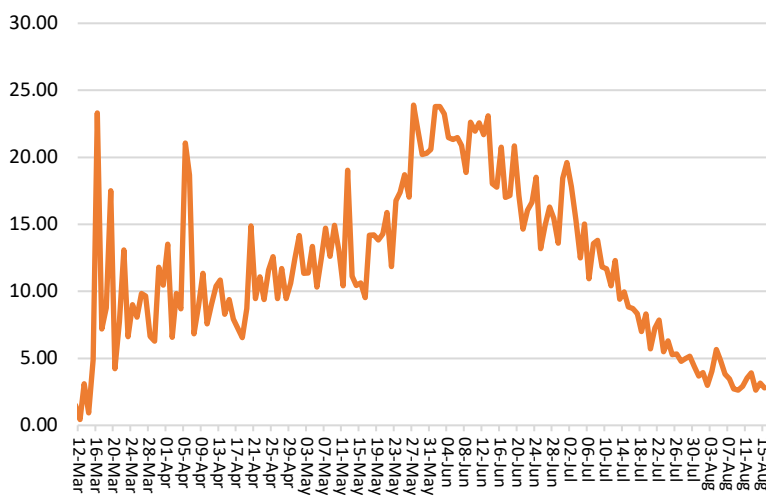

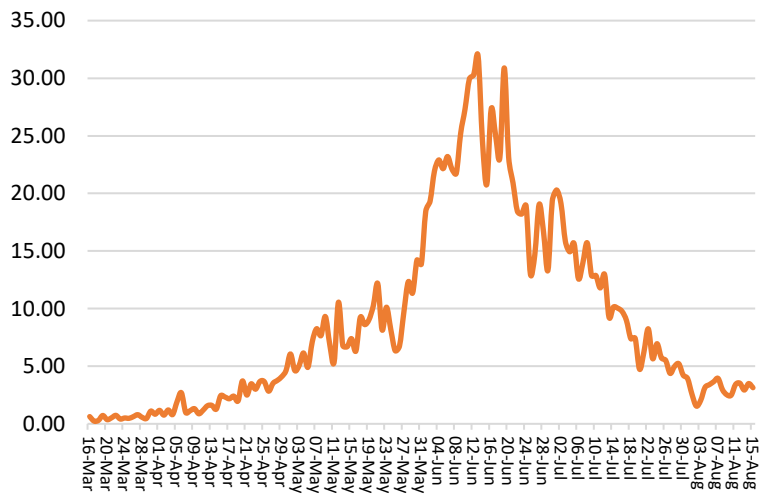

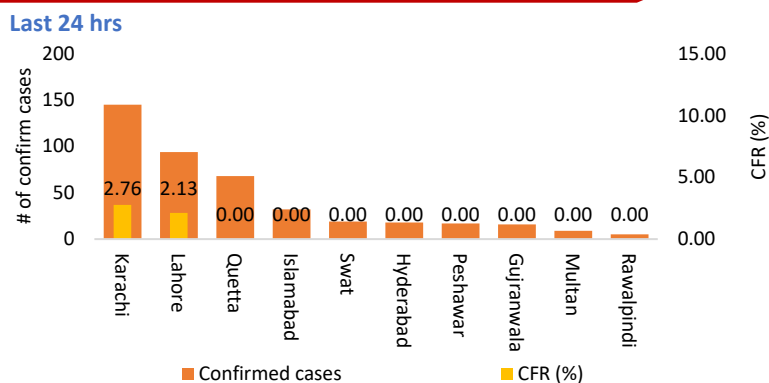

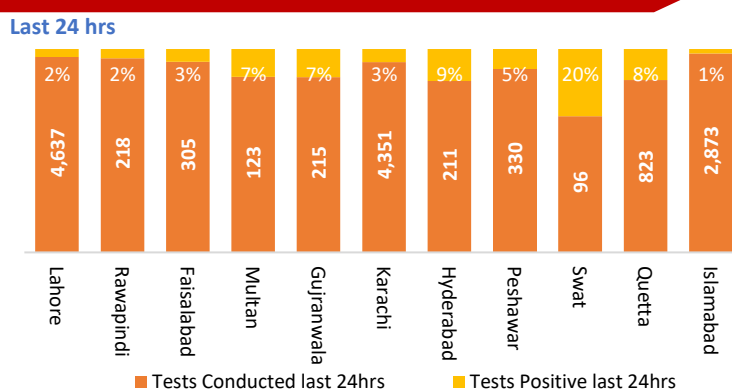

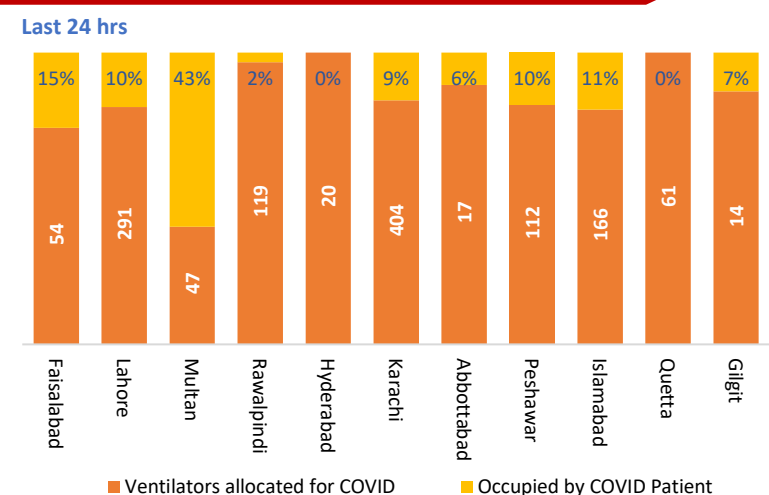
COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
