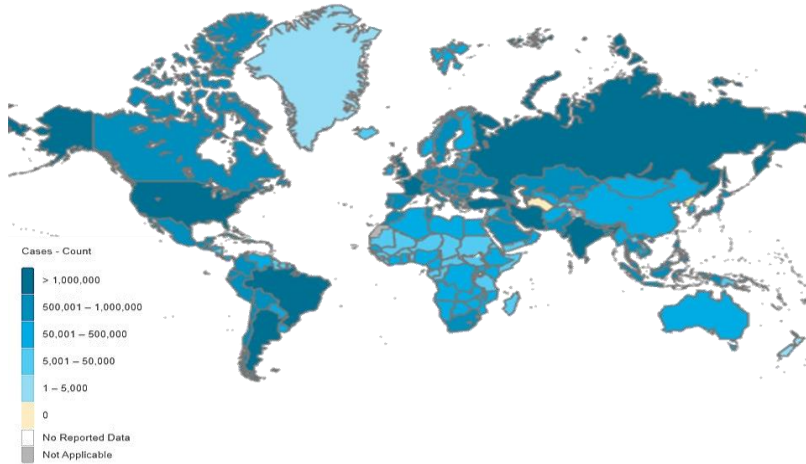




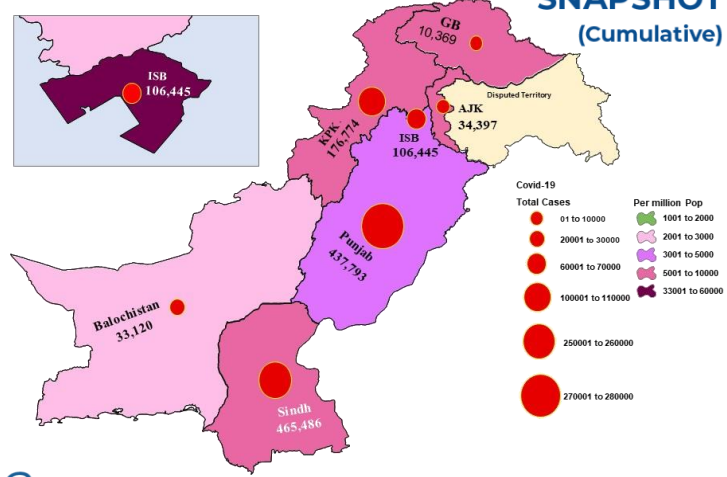

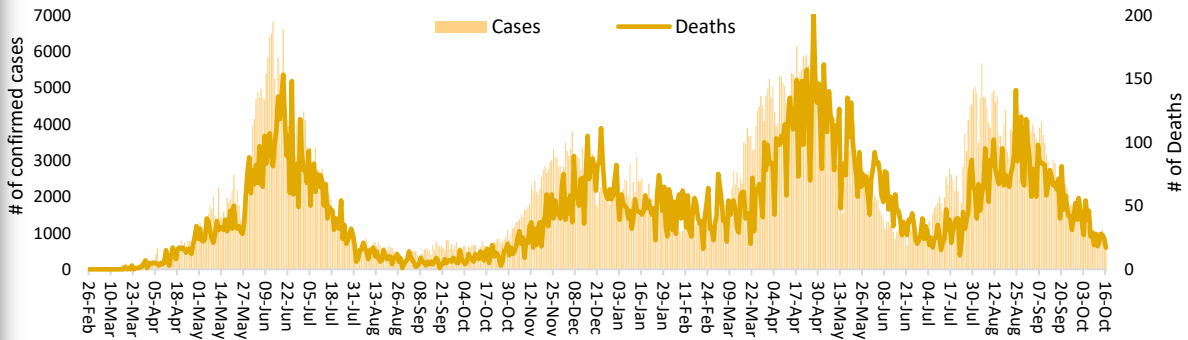

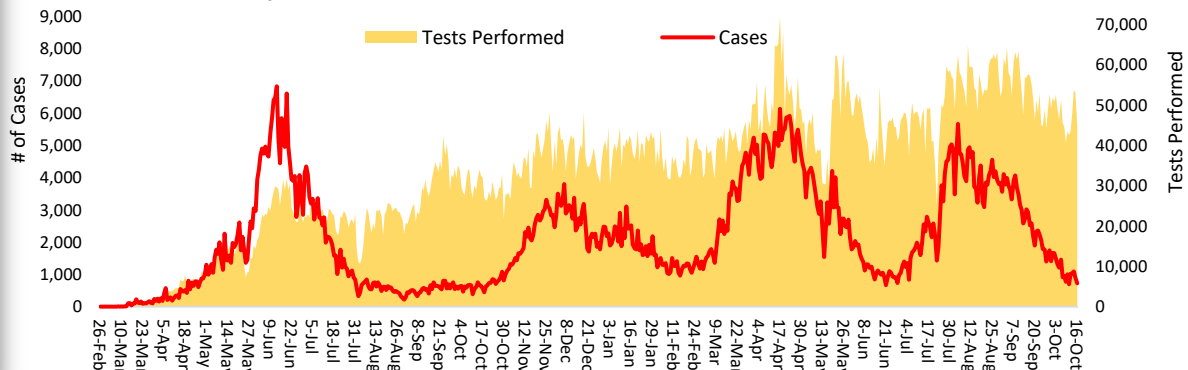

On 14th October 2021, WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala graced the Provincial Training of Trainers (ToT) session for Measles Rubella (MR) Catch-up Campaign at Movenpick hotel, Karachi. The Head of WHO Sub office Sindh, Dr Sara Salman accompanied the WR. These trainings are meant to build the capacity of Master Trainers who will cascade the knowledge and skills to all levels in their districts a head of the MR catch up campaign to be held in November 2021. A total of 44 sessions have been conducted so far, with 435 participants trained.

In his speech, Dr Palitha reiterated the importance of Measles Rubella Catch-up Campaign and impressed upon the participants to ensure that the knowledge they have gained from the training is effectively cascaded to other staff at the district and lower level. He pledged WHO support towards a successful MR campaign.
