

### **Executive Summary**

Pakistan reported **2,085** new cases of COVID-19 on **16** July **2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **259,999** with **5,475** deaths (CFR: **2.10%**). Out of the total **70,787** currently active cases, **2,939** cases are hospitalized, out of which **1,895** (**64.47%**) are in critical condition. **67,848** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **183,737** (**70.66%**) have recovered and discharged.


### Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan






# **COVID-19 case density/million Population**

### **Daily Mortality in Pakistan**











# COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
