

### COVID-19 case density/million Population




### Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **488** new cases of COVID-19 on **16 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **289,215** with **6,175** deaths (CFR: **2.13%**). Out of the total **13,953** currently active cases, **1,307** cases are hospitalized, out of which **771 (58.99%)** are in critical condition. **12,646** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **269,087 (93.04%)** have recovered and discharged.


### Daily Lab tests conducted in Pakistan

12-May to 16-Aug 2020




### Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan




## Coordination & Meetings



Course is delivered through combination of lectures, self-study and practical sessions in hospital settings.

Topics covered include IPC department in healthcare settings, roles of the various staff in IPC, indicators of infection prevention & control, basics of infection prevention & control, sources of micro-organisms, routes of transmission and key principles of infection control among others.

## Maintaining Essential Health Services in Pakistan

The World Health Organization, Pakistan in collaboration with National AIDS Control Program and the Association of People Living with HIV/AIDS initiated a pilot project at two HIV treatment centers in Islamabad and Peshawar to track and re-engage 'Lost to Follow-up' clients during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The key objective of the initiative is to improve the adherence and HIV treatment outcome for people living with HIV/AIDS in Pakistan.

Community Supports Group (CSG) have been established to track 1200 defaulters for resumption of their life saving treatment for HIV in two major cities of Pakistan.




Counseling for life saving HIV Treatment drugs in Punjab




## COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
