

### **Executive Summary**

Pakistan reported **1,918** new cases of COVID-19 on **17** July **2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **261,917** with **5,522** deaths (CFR: **2.10%**). Out of the total **57,886** currently active cases, **2,690** cases are hospitalized, out of which **1,604** (**59.62%**) are in critical condition. **55,196** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **198,509** (**75.79%**) have recovered and discharged.


### Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan






# **COVID-19 case density/million Population**

### **Daily Mortality in Pakistan**






### **Meeting & Coordination**

Today, 18 July 2020, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with the Provincial Health Department, Sindh conducted training of laboratory staff on COVID-19 sample collection and Transportation. The training was conducted at the Director General Health Services office in Hyderabad, Sindh province. Seventeen participants from districts Hyderabad, Badin, Tando Muhammad Khan, Tando Allah Yar, Sujwal, Mirpurkhas, Jamshoro, Thatta and Matiari attended the training. WHO has so far trained 71 laboratory staff in six sessions from 29 districts of Sindh, on safe collection and transportation of COVID-19 samples.








# COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
