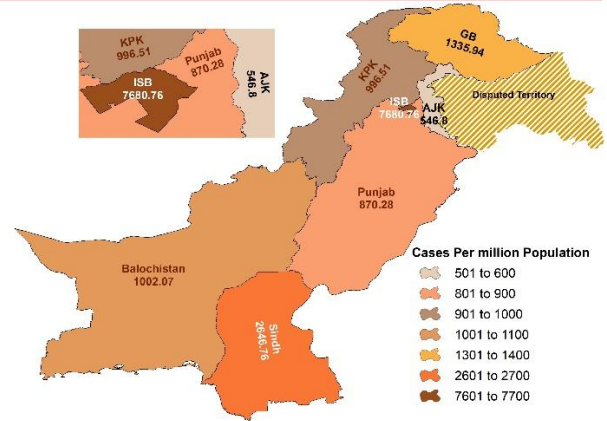

### COVID-19 case density/million Population

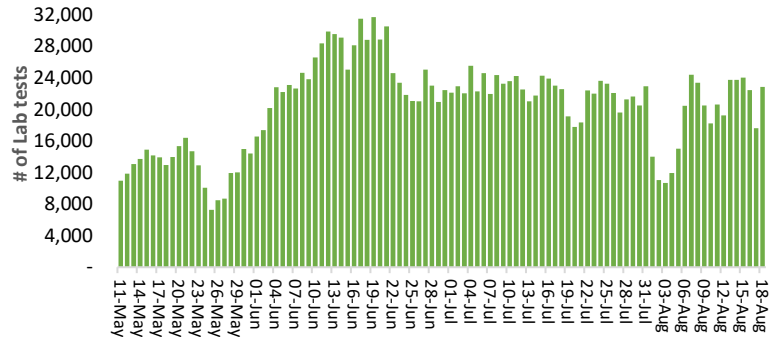


### Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **613** new cases of COVID-19 on **18 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **290,445** with **6,201** deaths (CFR: **2.13%**). Out of the total **12,116** currently active cases, **1,241** cases are hospitalized, out of which **743 (59.87%)** are in critical condition. **10,875** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **272,128 (93.69%)** have recovered and discharged.

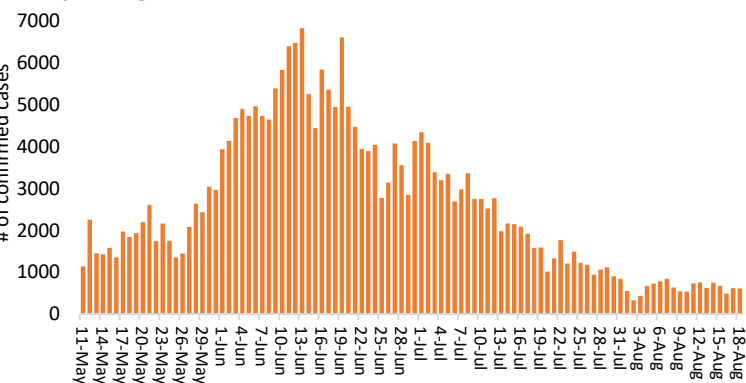
### Daily Lab tests conducted in Pakistan

11-May to 18-Aug 2020



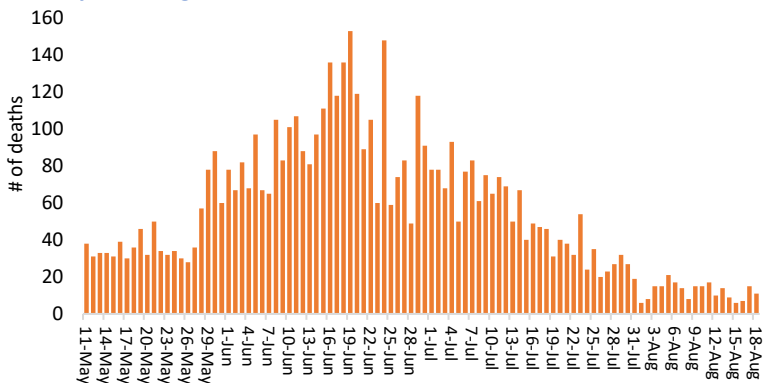
### Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan

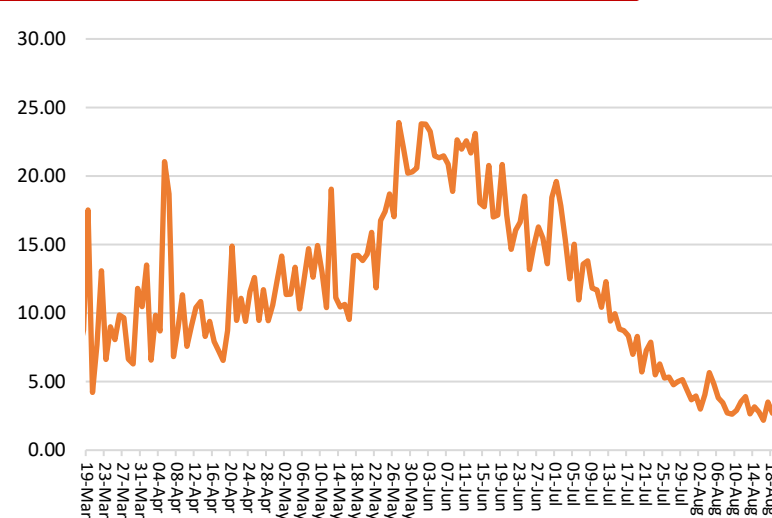


## Coordination & Meetings

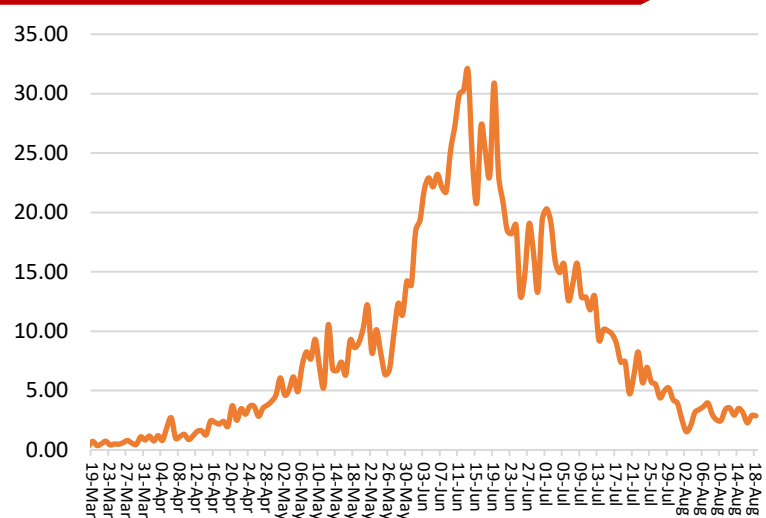

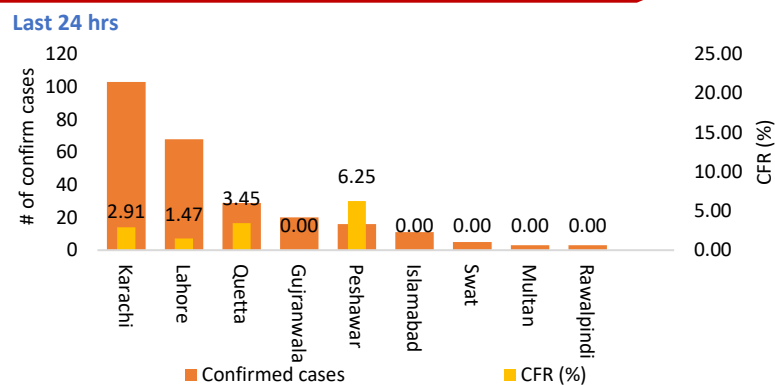
The main areas of discussion were importance of adherence to protocol of typhoid surveillance, data interpretation and analysis, and feedback on their surveillance data.



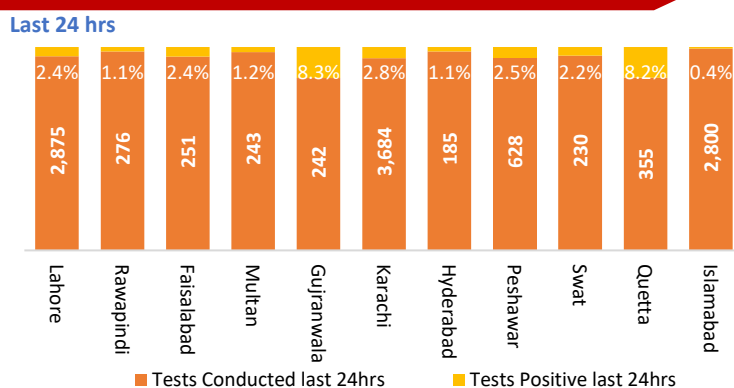

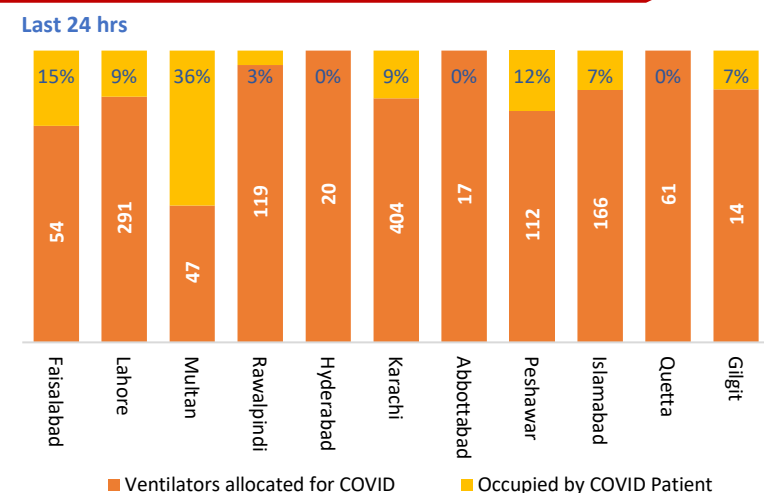
## COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
