

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **1,332** new cases of COVID-19 on **21** July **2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **267,428** with **5,677** deaths (CFR: **2.12%**). Out of the total **51,283** currently active cases, **2,394** cases are hospitalized, out of which **1,436** (**59.98%**) are in critical condition. **48,889** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **210,468** (**78.70%**) have recovered and discharged.


Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan






COVID-19 case density/million Population

Daily Mortality in Pakistan






Meeting & Coordination




