

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **591** new cases of COVID-19 on **22 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **292,765** with **6,235** deaths **(CFR: 2.12%)**. Out of the total **10,694** currently active cases, **1,173** cases are hospitalized, out of which **696 (59.33%)** are in critical condition. **9,521** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **275,836 (94.21%)** have recovered and discharged.









Daily Attact rate/million Population







COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by Districts
