



INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE




TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.




Pakistan reported **1,594** new cases of COVID-19 on **23** January **2021**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **532,412** with **11,295** deaths (CFR: **2.12%**). Out of the total **34,628** currently active cases **2,767** cases are hospitalized.

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with the Provincial EPI Program, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP), is conducting the Training of Master Trainers on "Reach Every District/ Reach Every Community (RED/REC) strategy. The training started on 18 January at Pearl Continental Hotel Peshawar and will conclude on 26 January 2021. The objective of the training is to train District Master Trainers on RED/REC strategy to achieve the goal of 80% immunization coverage in all districts in KP. District EPI Coordinators, District Superintendent Vaccination and WHO Immunization Officers from all district attended the training. Additional trainings at districts level will be conducted to develop immunization micro plans for the districts.

Director General Health Services KP, Dr Niaz Muhammad inaugurated the training. In his inaugural speech, Dr Niaz appreciated the WHO Pakistan's continuous support for strengthening routine immunization in the country.
