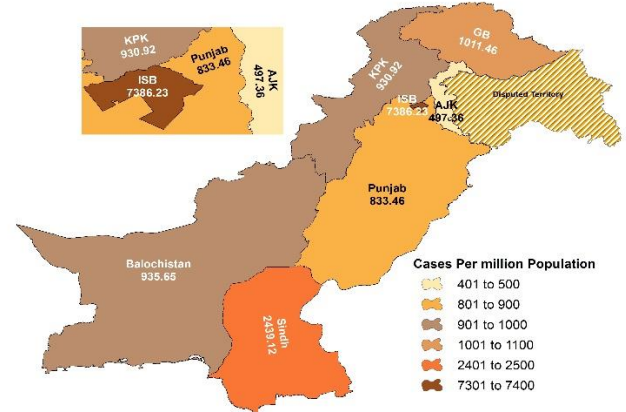

COVID-19 case density/million Population

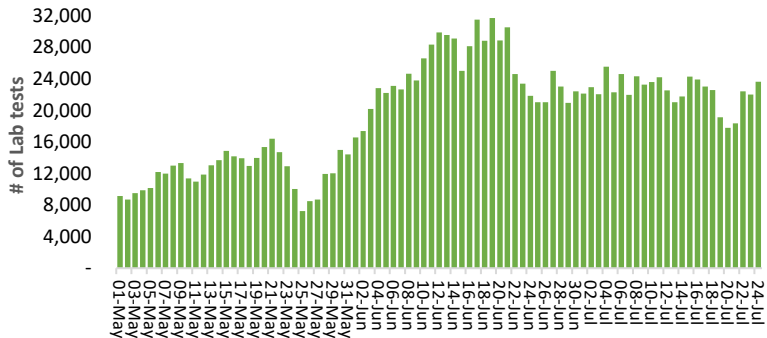


Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **1,487** new cases of COVID-19 on **24 July 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **271,887** with **5,787** deaths (**CFR: 2.12%**). Out of the total **29,504** currently active cases, **2,287** cases are hospitalized, out of which **1,294 (56.58%)** are in critical condition. **27,217** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or in-home isolation. A total of **236,596 (87.01%)** have recovered and discharged.

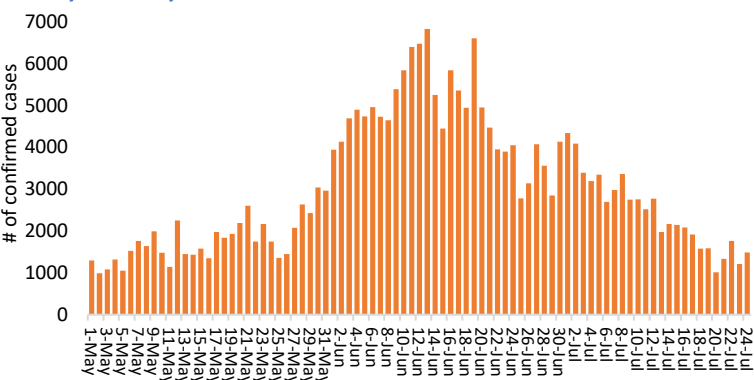
Daily Lab tests conducted in Pakistan

01 May to 24 July 2020



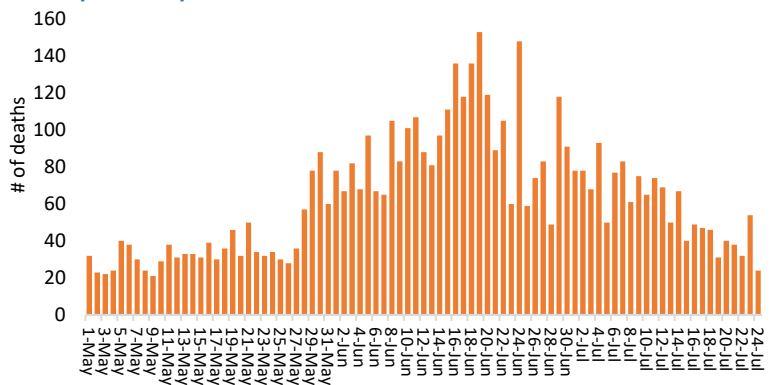
Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan

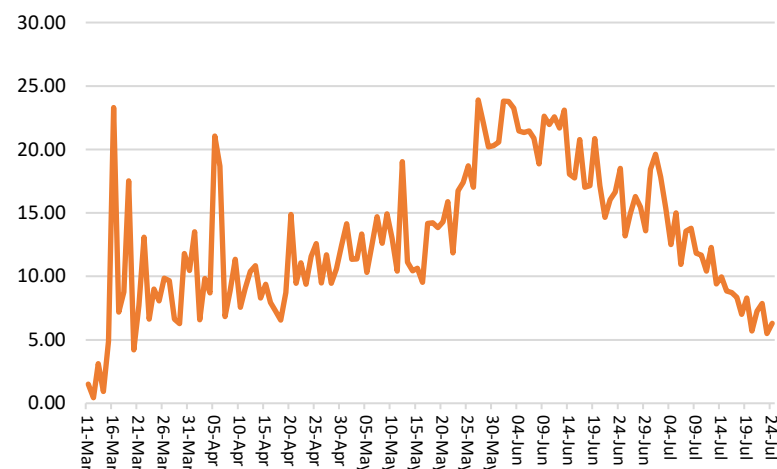


Meeting & Coordination

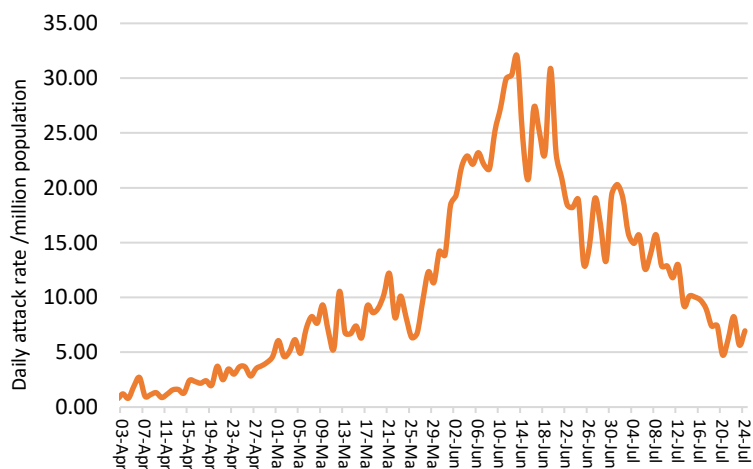

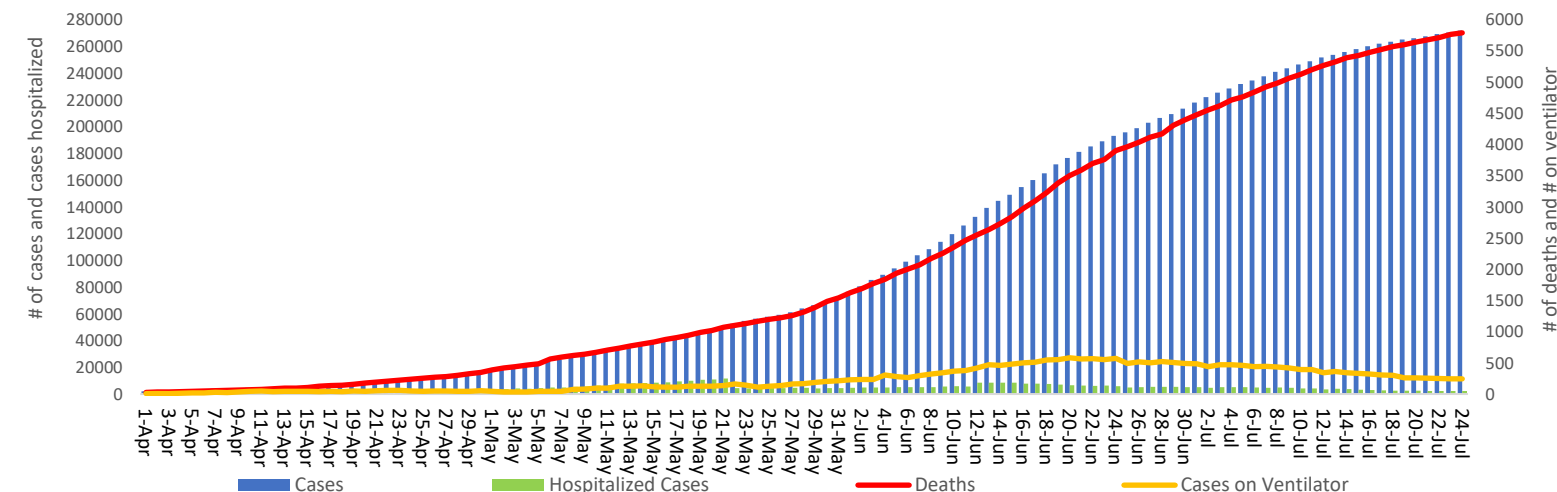
Daily Positivity rate in Pakistan



Daily Attack rate/million population



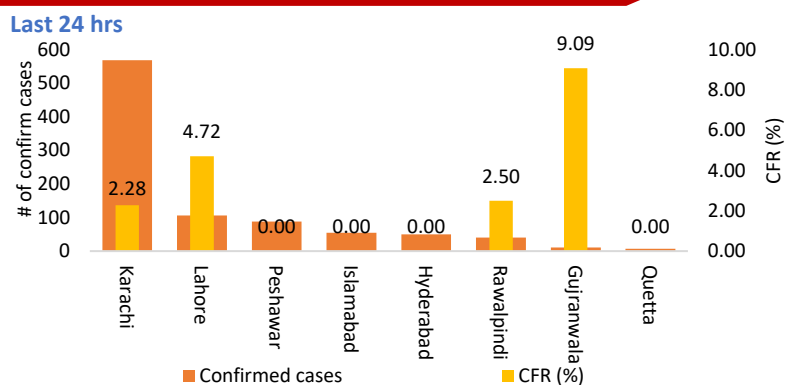
Trends of COVID-19 cases, hospitalized, on ventilator & Deaths



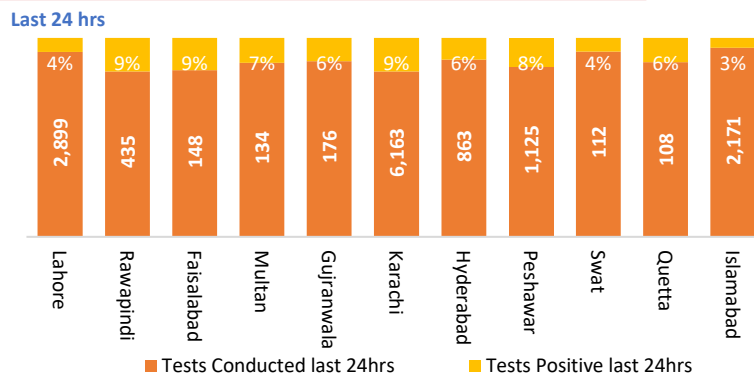

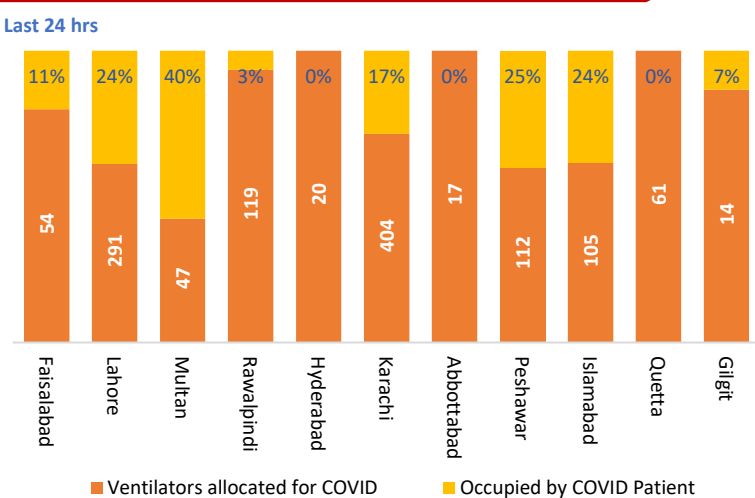
COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
