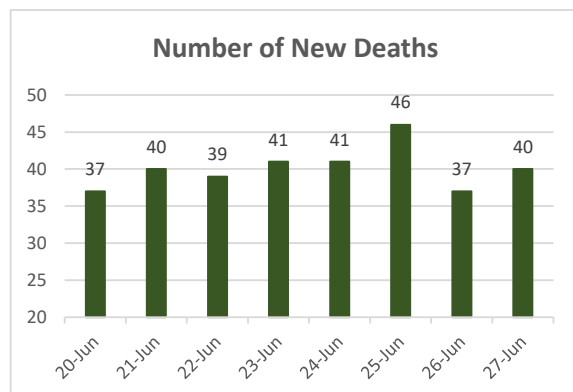
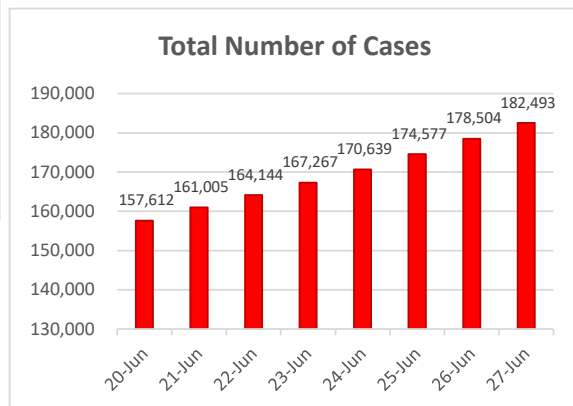
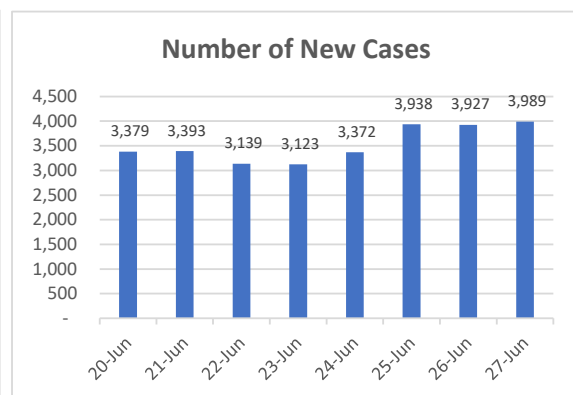

HIGHLIGHTS

- 35% of new cases are females and 11% are children.
- Cities with highest new infections were: Hufuf (487), Riyadh (389), Dammam (320), Makkah (310), Taif (275), and Madinah (186).
- With the addition of specialized testing centres across the Kingdom, daily PCR testing capacity increases to 45,000.
- Tetamman clinics reach 237 clinics in all regions of Saudi Arabia.
- The Ministry of Human Resources and Social Development has produced a document of the administrative violations of precautionary measures to counter the spread of "COVID-19".
- WHO updates criteria for releasing patients from isolation (see link below).
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages.
